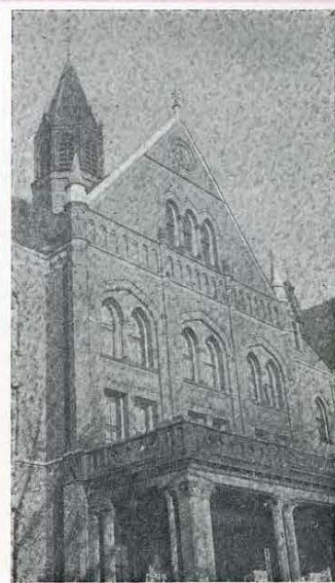

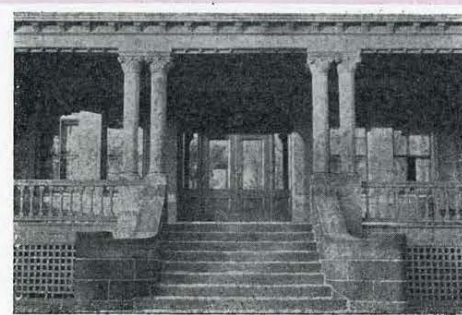
## MY HUMAN BEST FILLED WITH THE HOLY SPIRIT

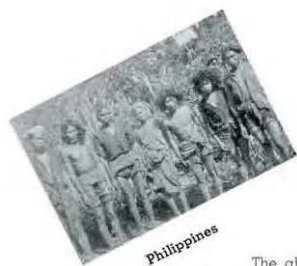

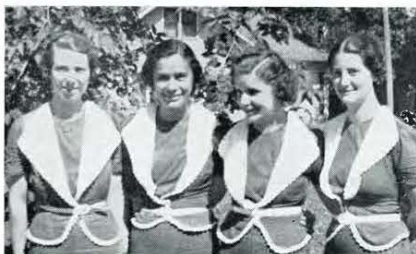

## RETROSPECT

In September, 1936, sixty-two eager young people enrolled for the first time in the St. Paul Bible Institute. Diversified as to background, we were united in a common purpose:—to better know and serve our Lord.

Commencement Day has already come for two of our number who have gone ahead to learn lessons of heaven. Our precious Lyla Mickelson went to be with the Master on September 6, 1937; and on November 27, 1938, friendly Mrs. Elva Sumpter joined her. We cherish the memory of these two yielded lives.

Others of our original group have married or have left to care for dependents; but we are still the largest class to graduate from this school.

Among the things we like to remember:

Efforts of our members put new life and style into the old school paper, "The Zithian", and it became the colorful, concise "Institute Digest". Other enterprising students published a chorus book. We have fostered the publication of the "Shield", first year-book of the school. These are just a few of the evidences of progress which have characterized our class as a whole.

On May 12, 1939, forty-one of us will receive diplomas from the various departments in which our work has been creditably completed, and will go forth with lives that have been blessed and enriched by our personal contacts as much as our planned study. We can say with the Psalmist, in testimony to our great God:

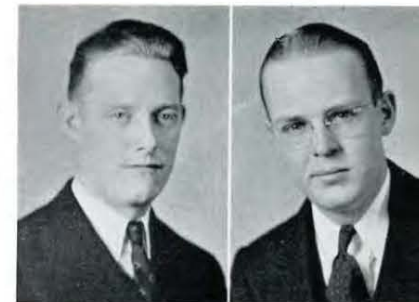
