## FOREWORD




## MY HUMAN BEST FILLED WITH THE HOLY SPIRIT

In September, 1936, sixty-two eager young people enrolled for the first time in the St. Paul Bible Institute. Diversified as to background, we were united in a common purpose:—to better know and serve our Lord.

Efforts of our members put new life and style into the old school paper, "The Zithian", and it became the colorful, concise "Institute Digest". Other enterprising students published a chorus book. We have fostered the publication of the "Shield", first yearbook of the school. These are just a few of the evidences of progress which have characterized our class as a whole.






