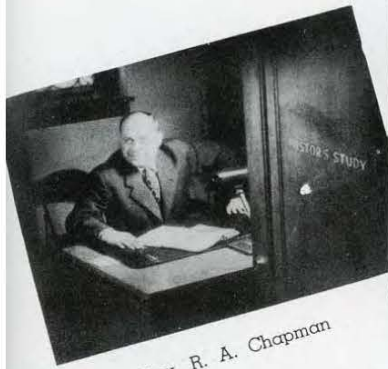
Above is a photo-likeliness of the proposed dormitory building for the Institute campus.
