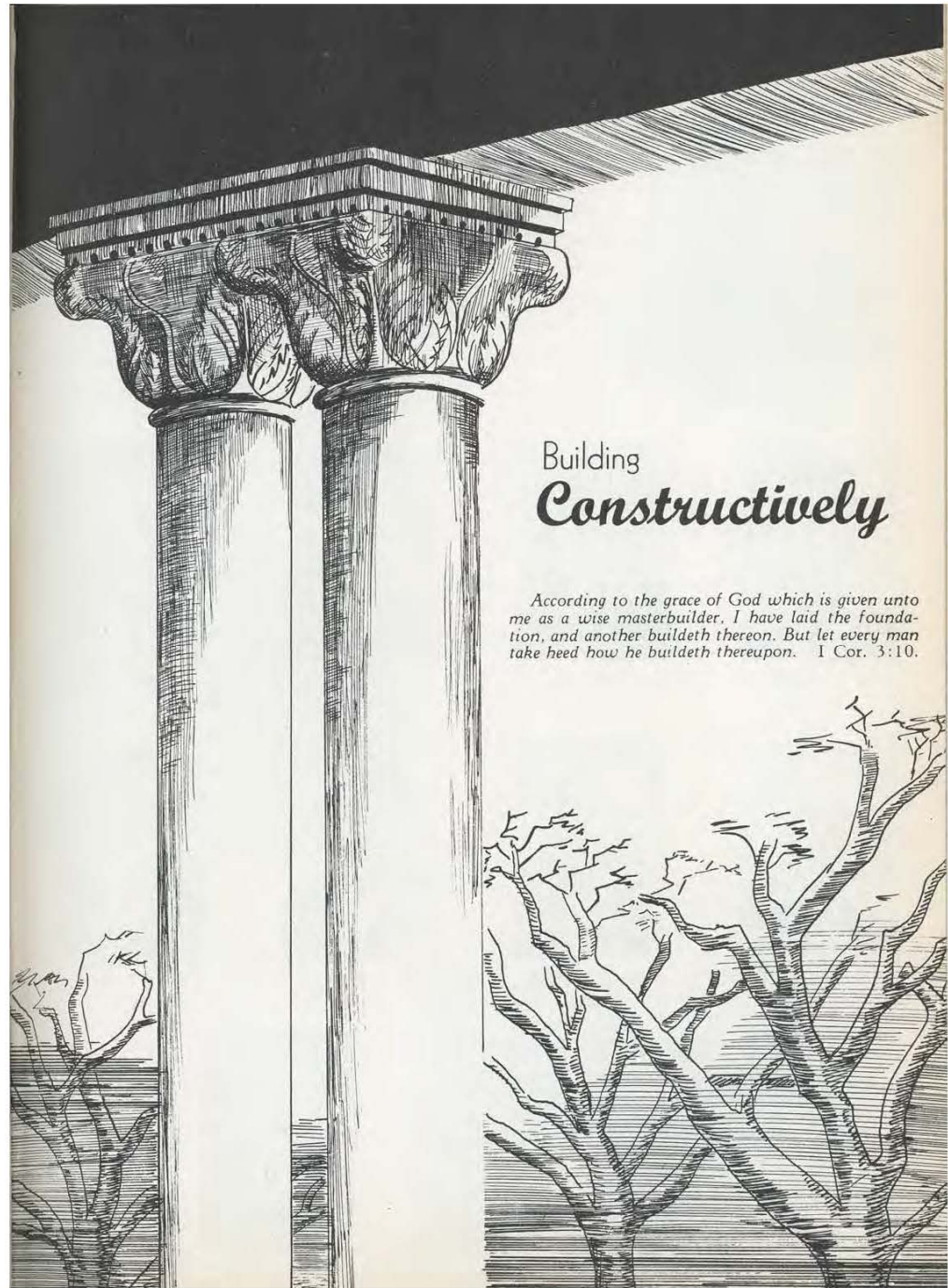
In Memoriam

On February 12, 1946, the St. Paul Municipal Auditorium opened its doors to the St. Paul Bible Institute for the presentation of World Missions Night.

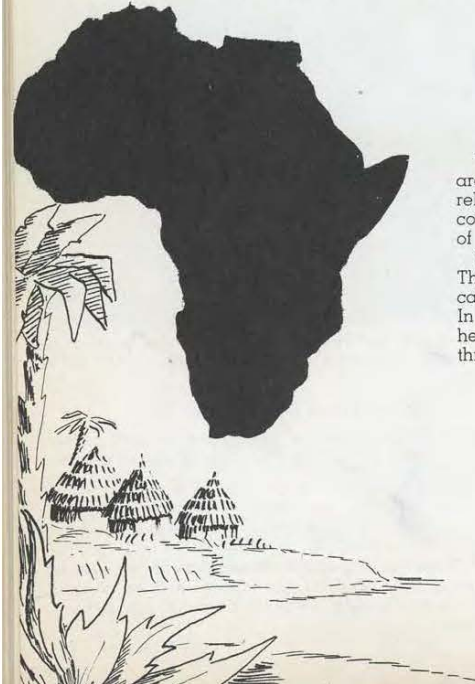

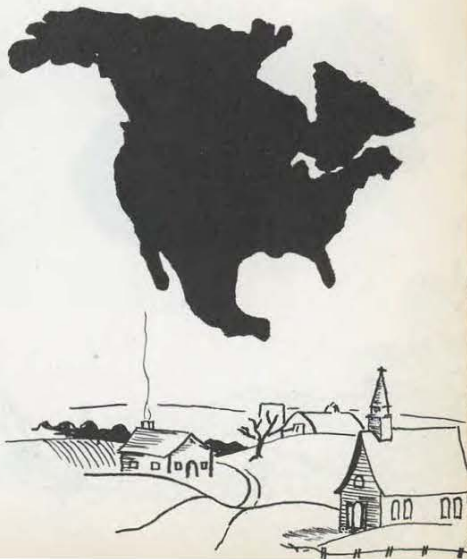

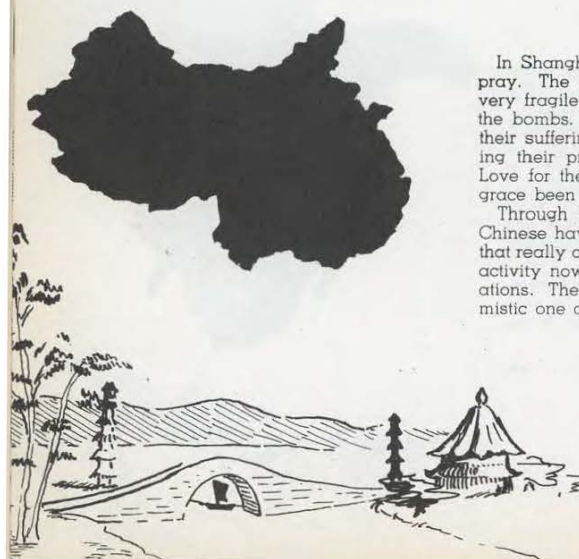

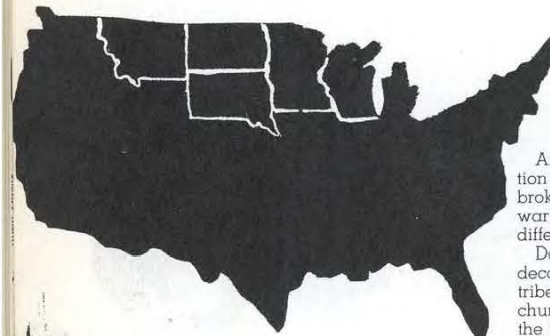

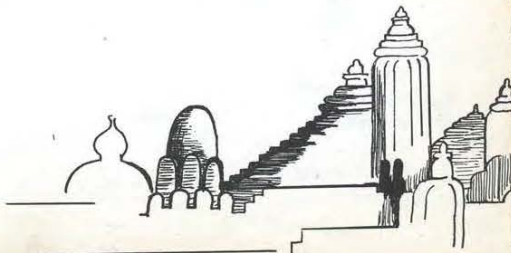
