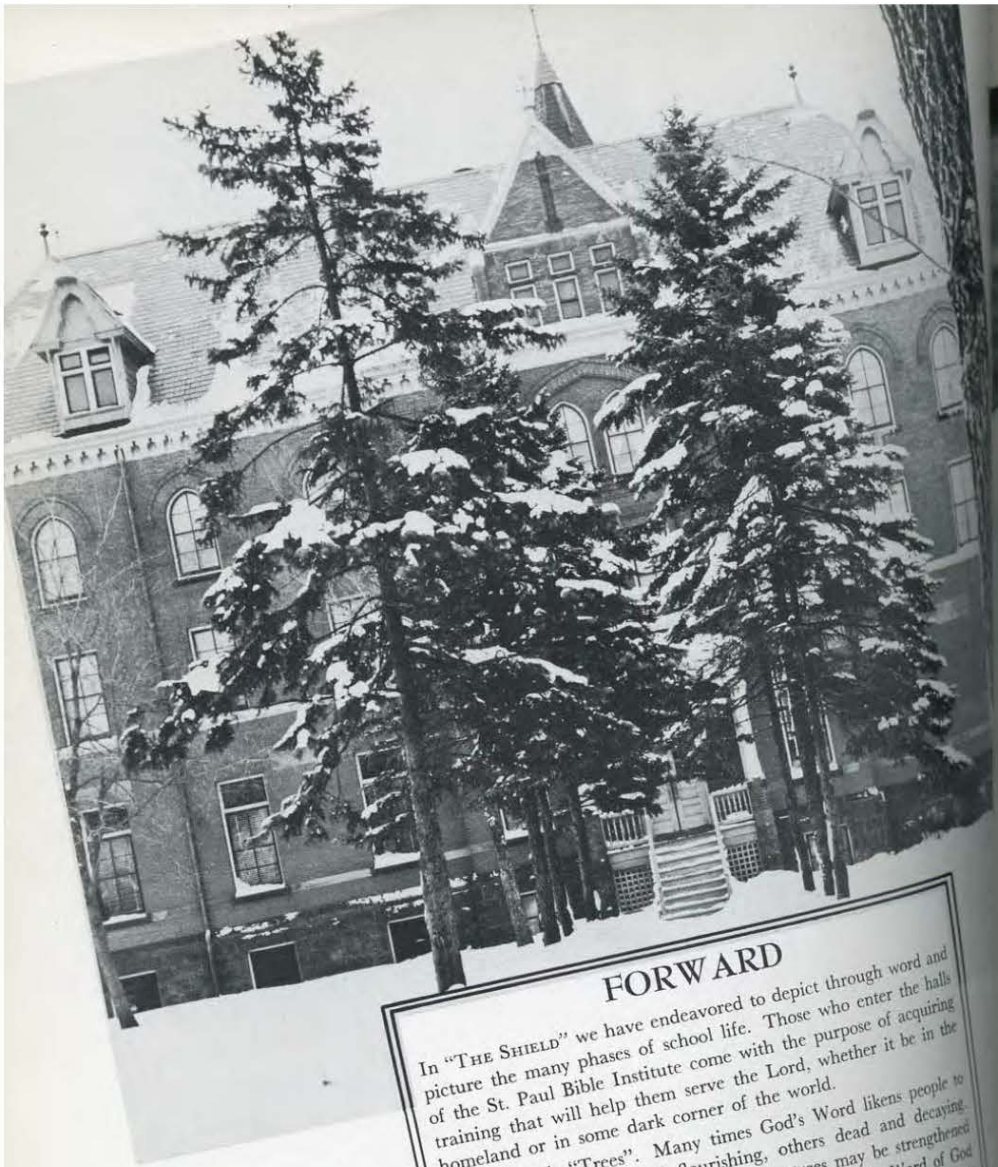

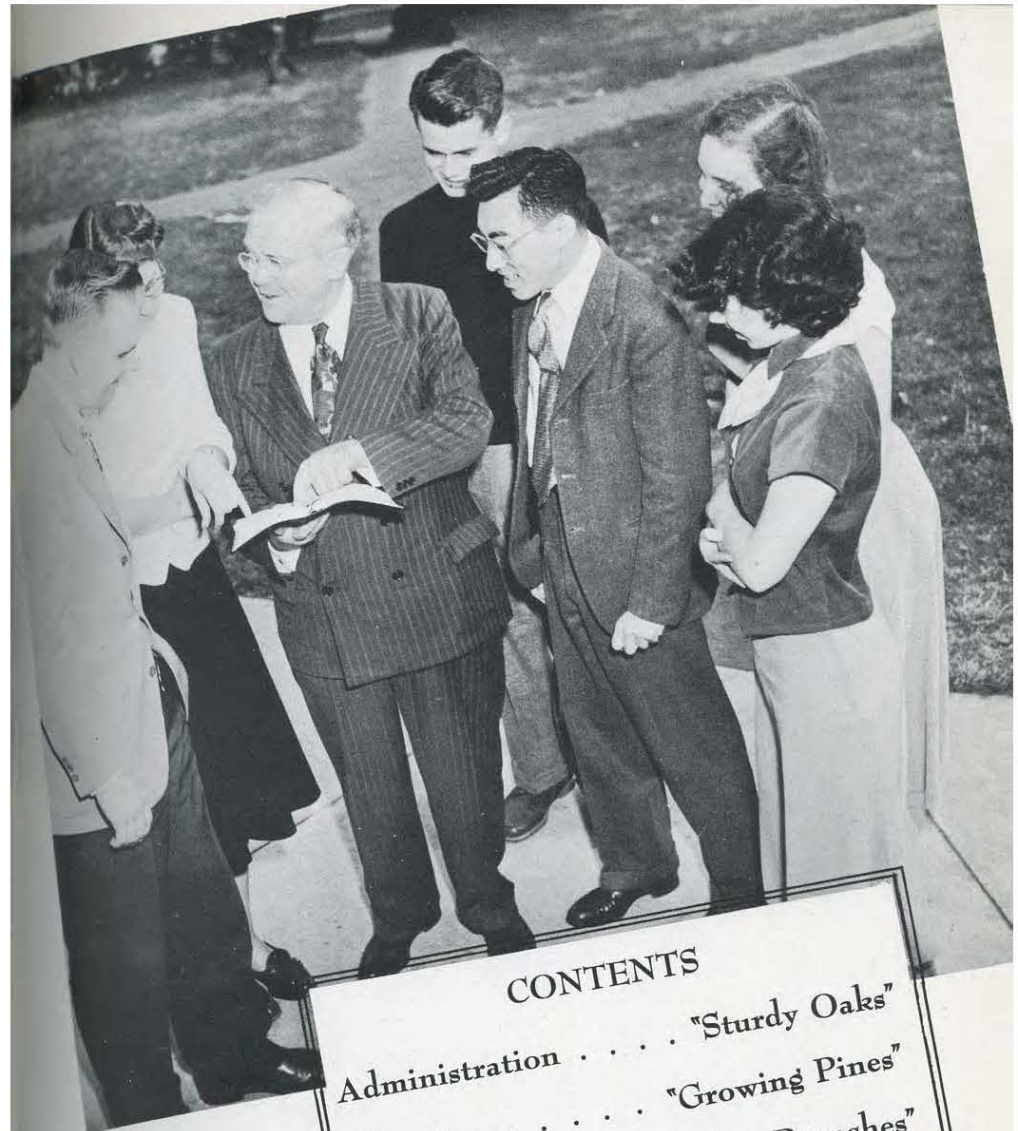


## FORWARD

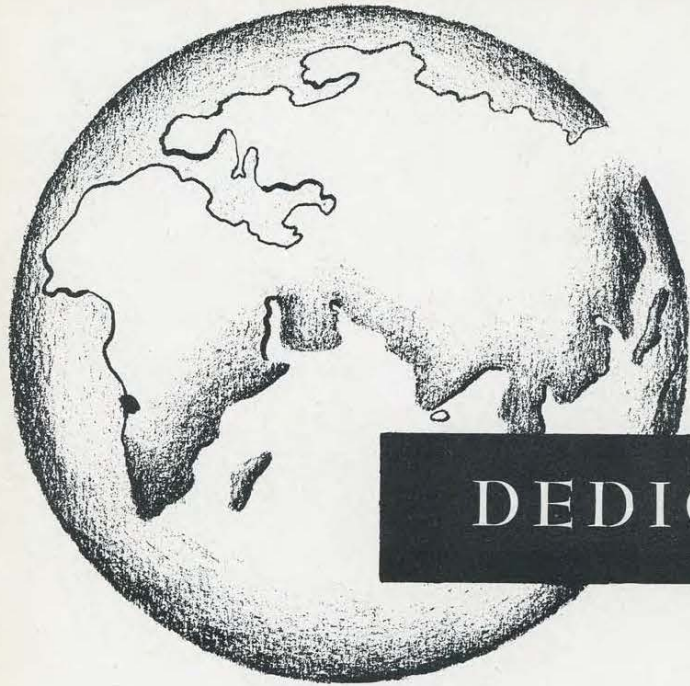
It is our intense desire to have portrayed on these pages a record of our spiritual growth, which we hope will prove a blessing to all who read these pages.

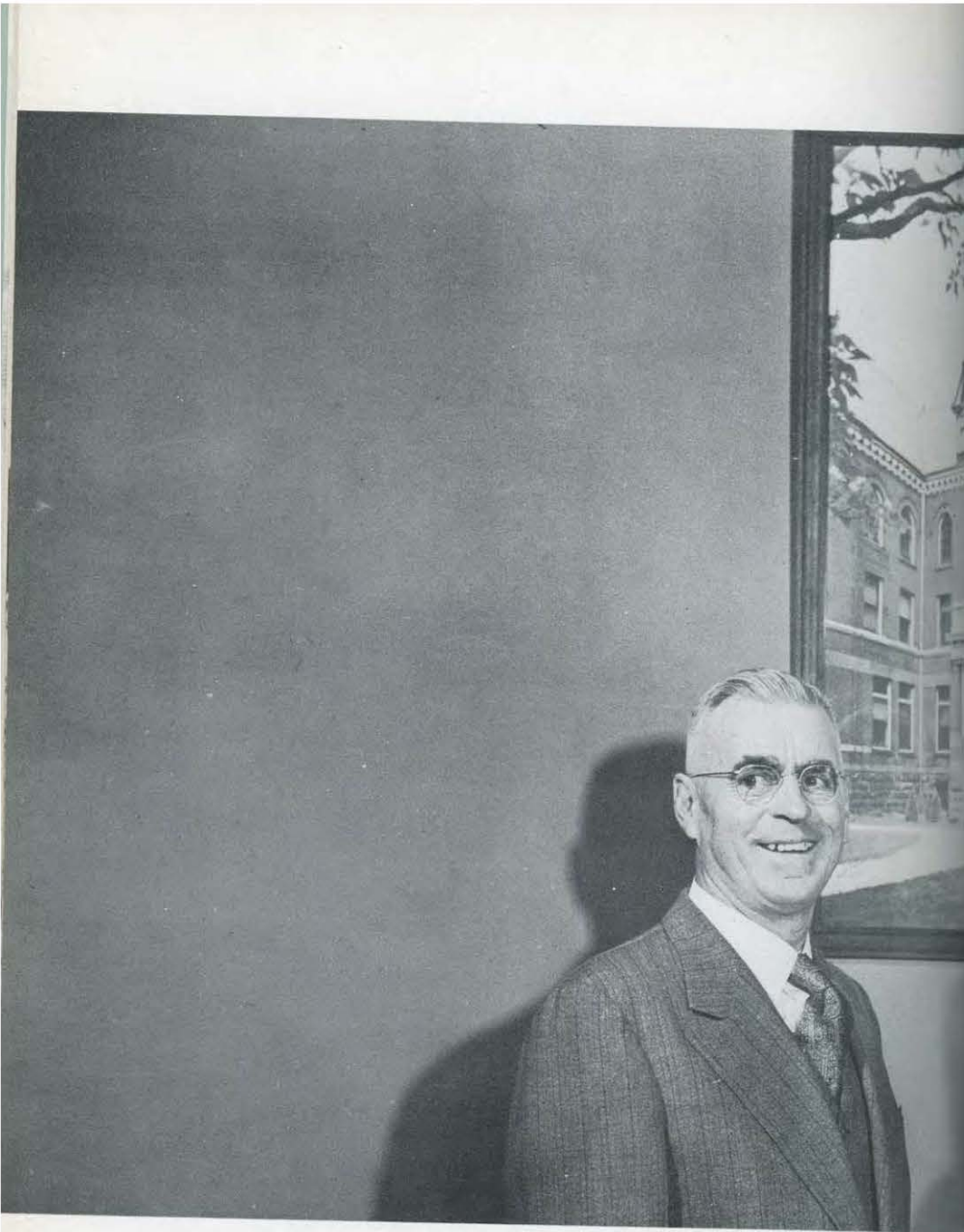




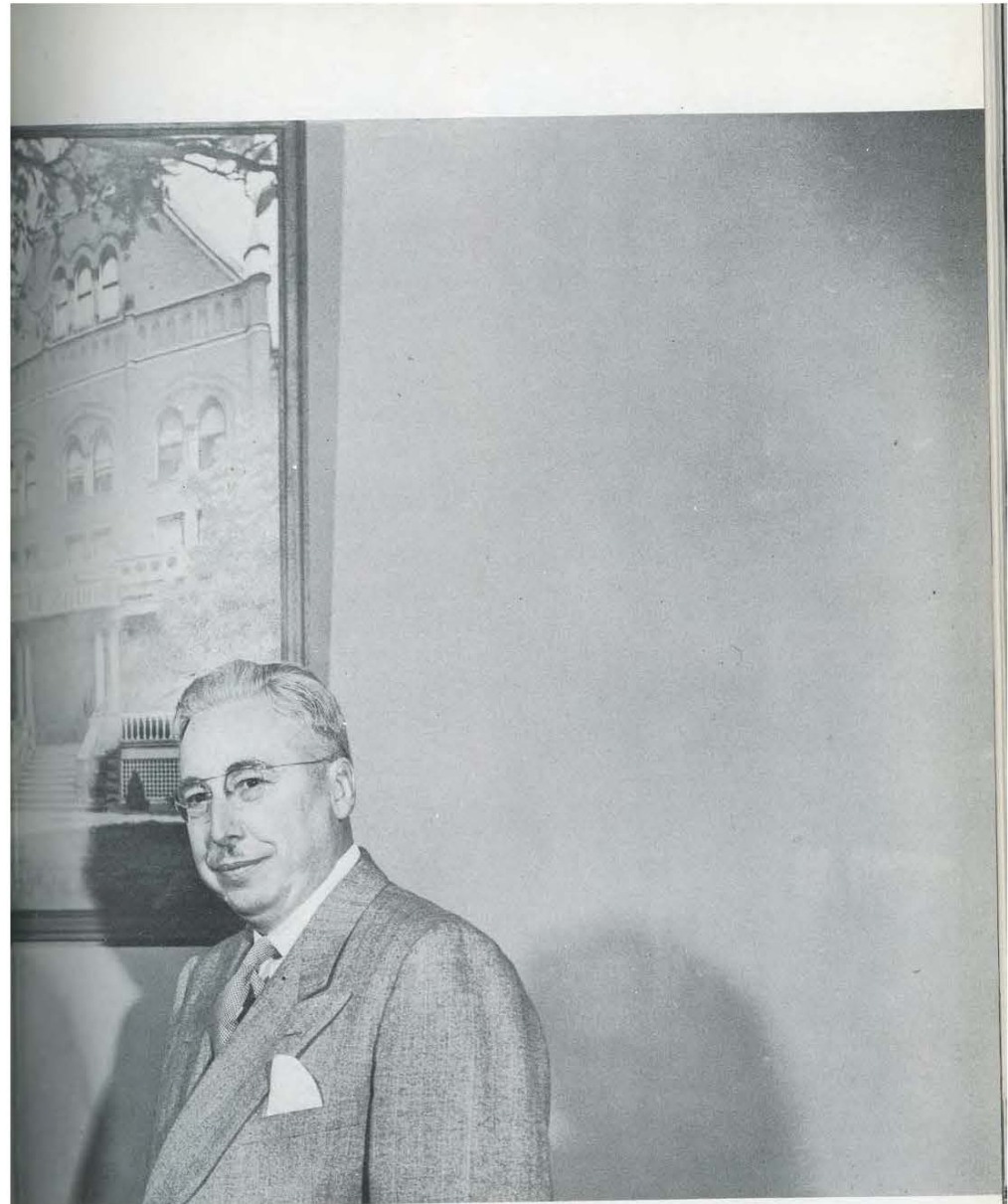

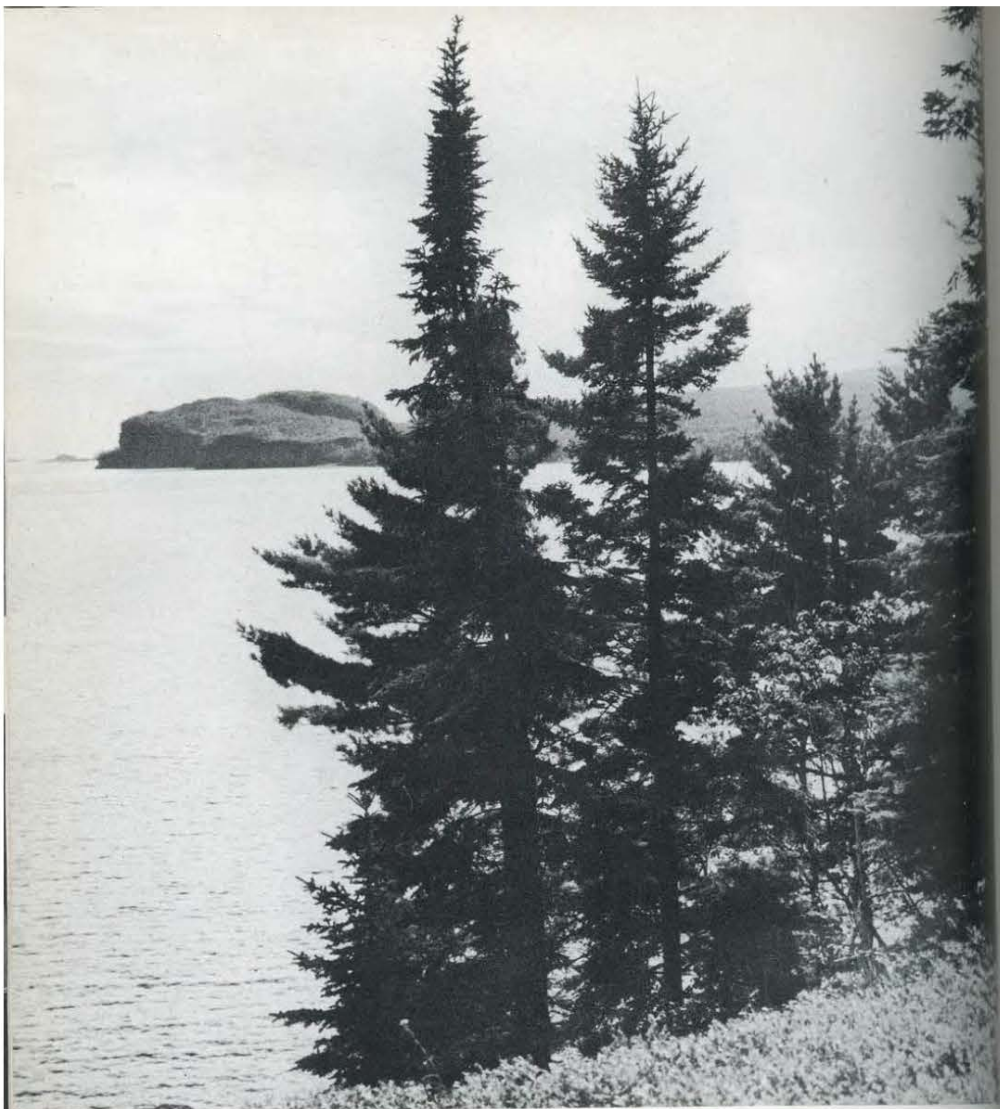


## GRADUATION 1950

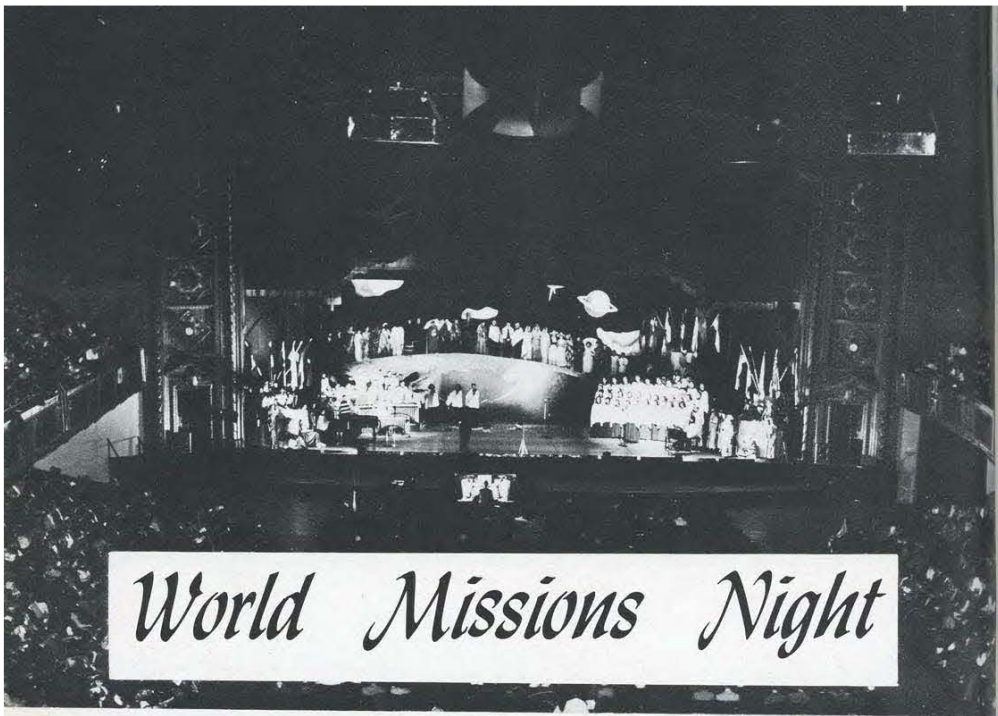

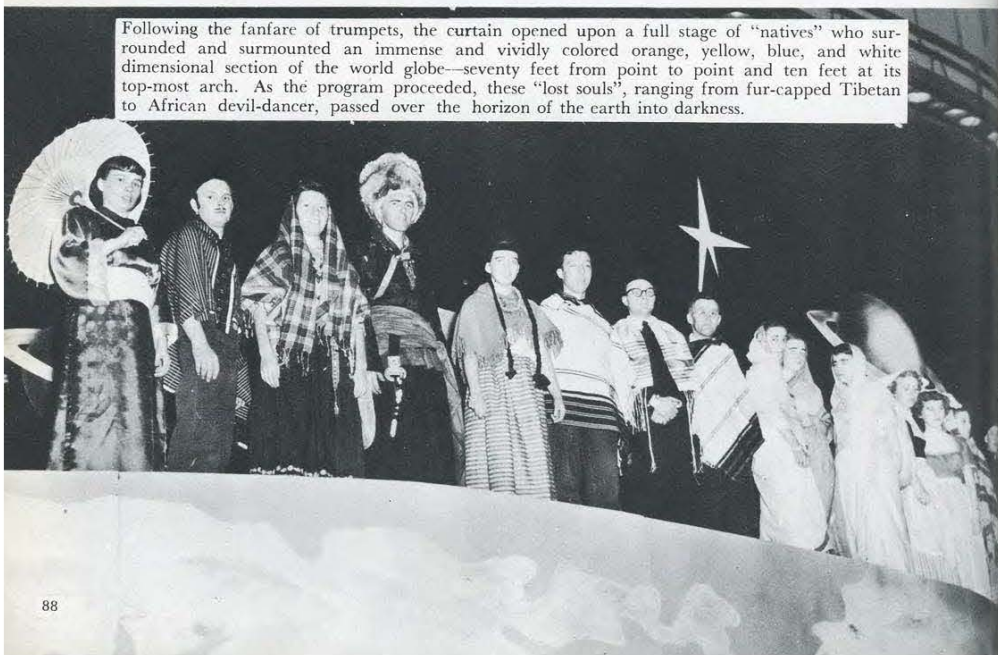






## World Missions Night
