## Seniors Reflect upon Three Years

The graduating class of 1954 comprises a group from many walks of life representing various portions of the country and several denominations. It has become a unified group, having shared burdens and blessings over the past three-year period. As they leave, the Seniors will take many vivid memories and some well-learned lessons with them. Many are going on to service.

The class during its senior year has responsibilities for which it has trained and prepared in the other two years. Their lives are observed and their advice is sought by underclassmen. Struggling through semester finals, discussing theological problems, fearfully preaching before friends, producing the year book, and participating in other activities will provide nostalgic memories in coming years. Most of all, they will reflect on bountiful spiritual outpourings upon the class generally and

individually. Each person can trace back his spiritual progression and can look with appreciation upon the teaching and experience he has had.



### of Spiritual Growth

Students who are receiving their degrees can look back upon at least four years of schooling. A four-year music degree course is offered at school. However, those receiving degrees in the Department of Theology and the Department of Christian Education have had their Bible School work supplemented by sixty hours of accredited college work and must have completed a thesis in their major. Beginning next year, this plan will differ in that the SPBI curriculum will offer all subjects required for these degrees. A degree is not considered a substitute, however, for that place in the Lord where one can say, "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom."

The three-year theology diploma course has as its ultimate goal a working knowledge of the Bible and practical knowledge of theology. Fifty of the ninety required hours are Bible and practical theology subjects. An academic approach is given to the studies of the books of the Bible, church history, Greek, etc. However, a practical outworking of the theory is stressed in such subjects as homiletics, apologetics, and pastoral theology. The course is culminated by an experiential study of the Holy Spirit in the senior year which enables a student to establish his thinking.



Many theology majors study the original Greek of the New Testament to gain a new and better insight into the Scriptures. Rev. Irving Peterson here guides his second-year class in construction of sentences.



## **Mission Majors Train for Service**

The Missions course, also a three-year diploma course, is for those who desire subjects geared to the needs and problems of prospective missionaries. Basic studies of the Bible, theology, and practical theology are required; but the course differs from the standard theology course in that the students study the history of missions, anthropology, principles of missions, and other such specialized courses. Also a year of language is required, and beginning phonetics is offered. In the near future, a four-year degree course will begin which will provide a broader training and learning program.



The initial year is not an easy one, but any upper classman can testify to the fact that some of life's most valuable lessons are learned in this perilous period.






However, the spirit of satisfaction in the student body speaks for the successfulness of the program the administration carries out.






### **WORLD MISSIONS NIGHT**

The Christian Church's triumph over spiritual darkness was the theme of World Missions Night, 1954. World Missions was presented April 9 and 10 in the Minneapolis Auditorium, respectively, with audi-ences totaling 12,200 and 1,000 turned away in St. Paul. Born out of the gospel miracle wrought in the personal lives of the participants—World Missions marked the prog-

ress of the gospel of Jesus Christ. From the heart of the Ballem to the edge of the Arctic redeemed men were represented as tokens of this progress. Through the staging of World Missions the world awakens to the fact that "The kingdom of this world is become the kingdom of our Lord and of His Christ; and He shall reign forever and ever".



### ISLAND WORLD



To the rallying morto, "Wings for Shangri La," the Island World Prayer Band has persevered in prayer on behalf of a project of the Christian and Missionary Alliance to purchase a new amphibian plane to be used in reaching forgotten people in the Baliem Valley of New Guinea. Today the "big bird" flies over stone age New Guinea. The program now under way in this area of the world promises to make missions history through the use of unusual methods to reach an unusual people. The Island World Prayer Band has pledged itself to a steadfast ministry of prayer to see this work accomplished.

### AMERICAN INDIAN



The American Indian Prayer Band has a reputation for enthusiasm and for arousing interest in the work of its particular field. Through correspondence, contact with near-by missionaries, and actual on-the-field experience, members of this band are well acquainted with the needs of their field. The consistent expansion of Indian Missions provides these students with an impetus to remain faithful in prayer on behalf of the 400,000 Indians of our country.

### **EUROPEAN NEAR EAST**



A little European orphan eats regularly and is clothed by the warm-hearted members of the European Near East Prayer Band. This is a new kind of project for them in one respect, but, on the other hand, they are merely following the Scriptural injunction to care for the fatherless.

This unusual project, plus the increase in membership of this group points up a reviving interest in sending the Gospel to Europe.

### INDIA



Faced with the problem of relying entirely upon the National Church to accomplish the task of evangelizing the millions of India, the India Prayer Band has taken active steps to aid in the training of a national worker in a Bible School. This year has seen the initiation of a project which was first intended to support one Indian Bible School student, but has resulted in the possible financing of two. With a sense of urgency, each member of this organization has combined earnest prayer support for the missionaries presently working in India with the practical assistance exemplified in the aid given a national worker. Geared to cope with the problems of reaching the modern Asiatic while anchored to a living faith, the India Prayer Band moves ahead meeting the tasks entrusted them.

### FRENCH INDO CHINA, SIAM



Communism! Nationalism! Economic Insecurity! Here are issues in which this prayer group has taken vital interest. Their vision has taken into consideration the effect of these factors on mission work. As a result, they have pledged themselves to pray with renewed effort for the lost souls of this area. This last year has witnessed a gratifying response to their labors. There are reported to be more converts, more inquirers, and more baptisms than ever before.

### LATIN AMERICA



Alerted early in the year to the need for the replacement of the antiquated Christian and Missionary Alliance printing press in Chile, this group of students interested in that field began praying for Divine help. In a very short time the needed \$20,000 was supplied and the necessary equipment on its way. In this fashion this group, banded together to pray regularly for Latin America, has a part in a ministry that not only supplies printed matter to the area in which it is located but to all Latin America and many Spanish-speaking groups in the United States.

### **AFRICA**



Seeing God accomplish the unusual has been the experience of the African Prayer Band. News has reached the prayer band that the native government of the Upper Volta Colony of French West Africa has decided to build and support a medical clinic to be used by American missionaries. This has been a demonstration of God's undertaking in a very unexpected way on behalf of those who pray.

This organization, long noted for its many alumni in active foreign missionary service, is presently looking forward to two recent members sailing for the Sudan.

### CHINA



While Communism has engulfed much of the Orient, the prayers of the China Prayer Band have become more determined with the assurance of the fulfillment of "things hoped for . . . and not seen." Its members have remained in touch with the gospel work still being carried on in these areas. Up-to-date news from nationalist workers in Hong Kong came to the group recently by means of tape recording.

With spirits undaunted by closed doors, the group has turned the problems confronting mission work in this area of the world into stepping stones to trusting the Lord for greater things in the Orient.

### HOME MISSIONS



Although oftentimes eclipsed by foreign missionary interest, homeland missions find warm prayer support in the members of the Home Missions Prayer Band. This group of praying students has learned of some home workers faced with unsurmountable financial difficulties. Through correspondence, news of just such a case reached the Home Missions Prayer Band. To them this presented a challenge to call upon God. As the result of earnest prayer, needs in this specific case were met and the worker was enabled to continue reaching the lost of our own country. A new sidelight this year in the activities of the band has been the publication of a pamphlet acquainting the student body with the needs and problems of home missions.





### **Christian Service**

The student accepts his assignment for the purpose of proclaiming the Way of Salvation to those who know not Christ, and also to show that the Gospel which they proclaim is workable—in their own lives. The most forceful weapon in preparing the heart of man to receive this message, as well as the heart of the man who proclaims this message, is prayer. Wednesday night of each week Christian Service meets to pray. Each group sent forth again meets for a time of prayer preceding their departure.

Miss Elaine Madsen assists Mr. French in the Christian Service Department. The Christian Service Department, supervised by Mr. French, provides opportunity for students to develop another phase of their practical training while in school. Christian Service is presenting the Good News, the message of salvation, in almost every imaginable way. Assignments given to students send them to hospitals, to the street corner distributing tracts, to the mission on Skid-Row, to the church. Some are further privileged to take part in religious education under the released time program for religious education, while others have permanent assignments in the capacity of Sunday School teachers and Child Evangelism teachers.
