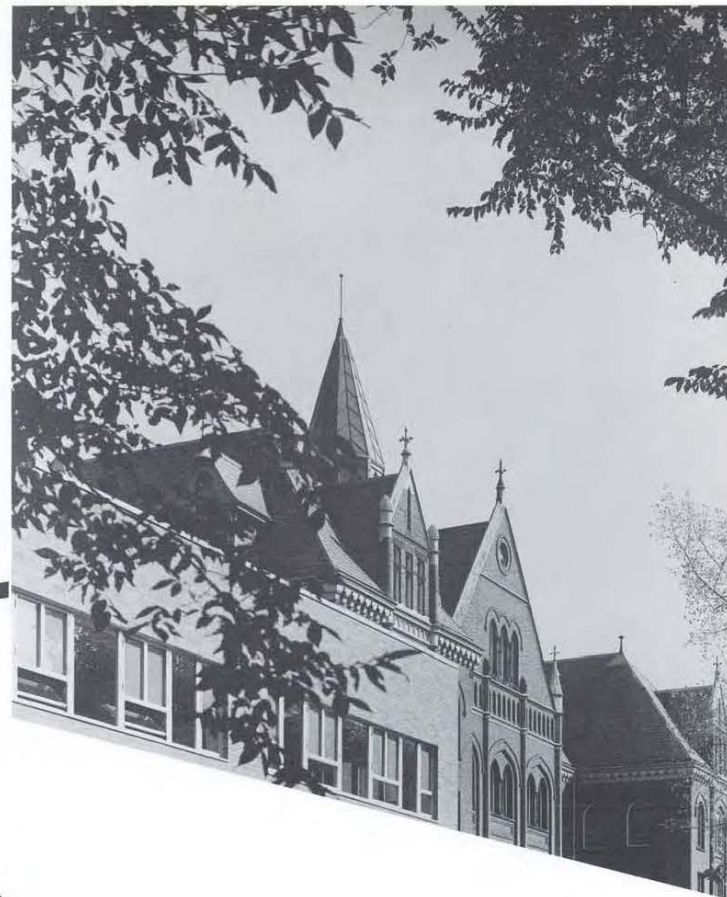

On April 20, 1954, the first permanent missionary party of the Christian and Missionary Alliance flew over the towering mountains which for centuries have isolated the stone age Dani people of the Baliem Valley. One year later, on April 28, 1955, the price for that invasion was paid when Al Lewis, piloting that same plane enroute to the Baliem, lost his life in a crash on a lonely mountain side.

The testimony of chief pilot Albert J. Lewis was profusely illustrated by deed and finally consummated in what is known as death, but what must have been to him a sudden and glorious entrance into heaven itself.*
