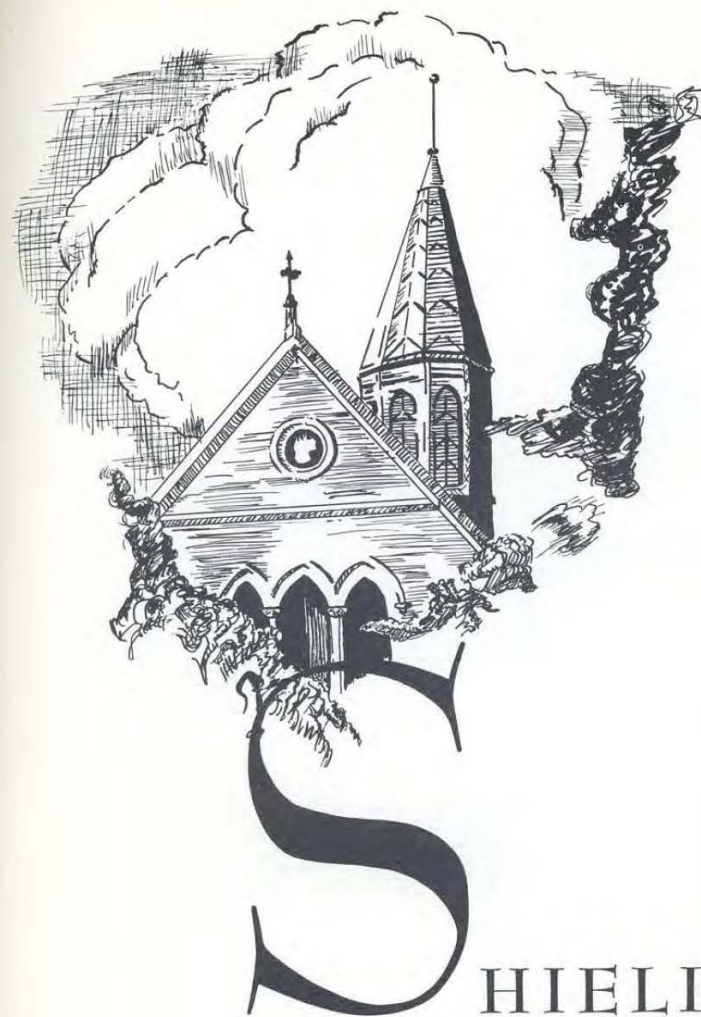

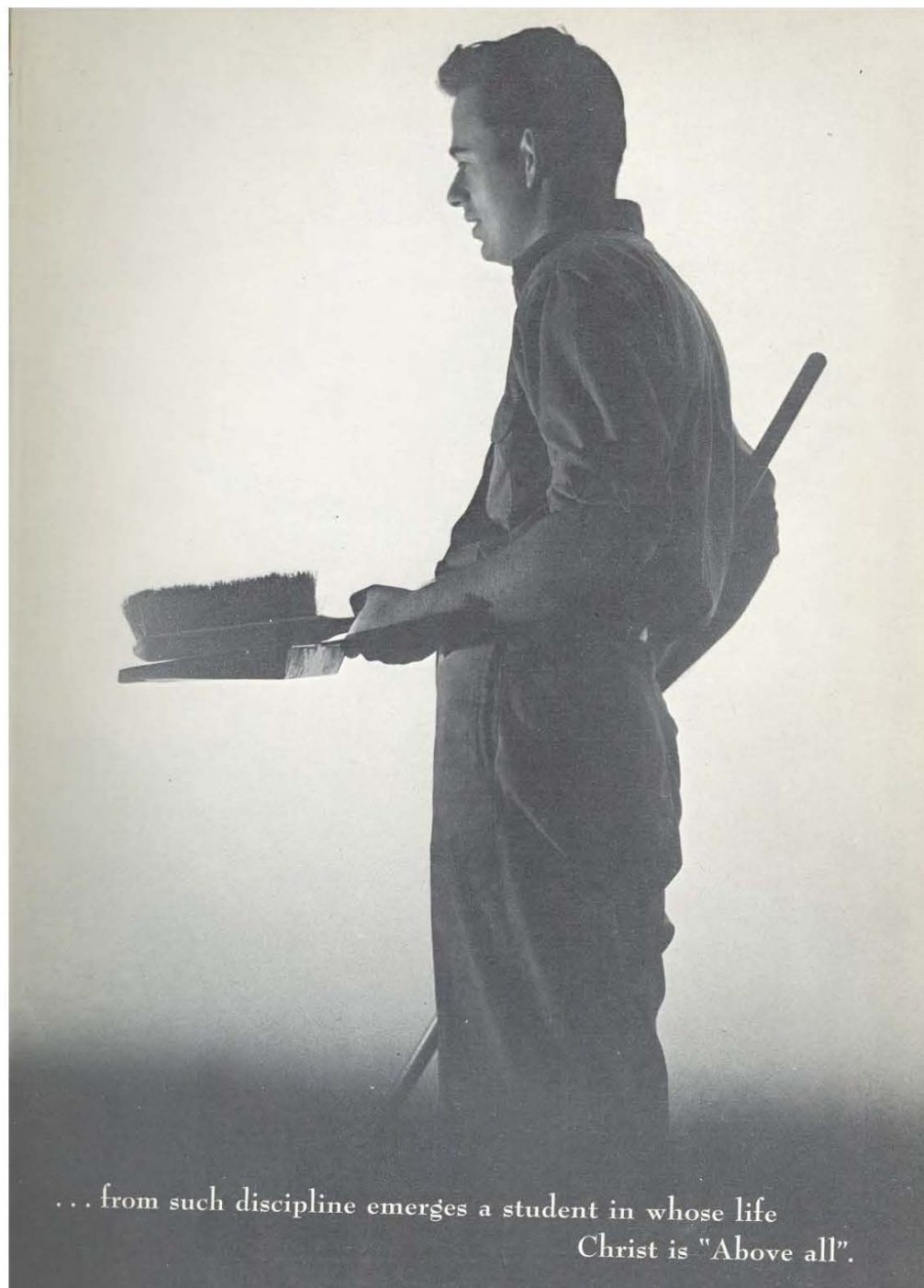

temptation; of responding to God-sent commands; but . . .

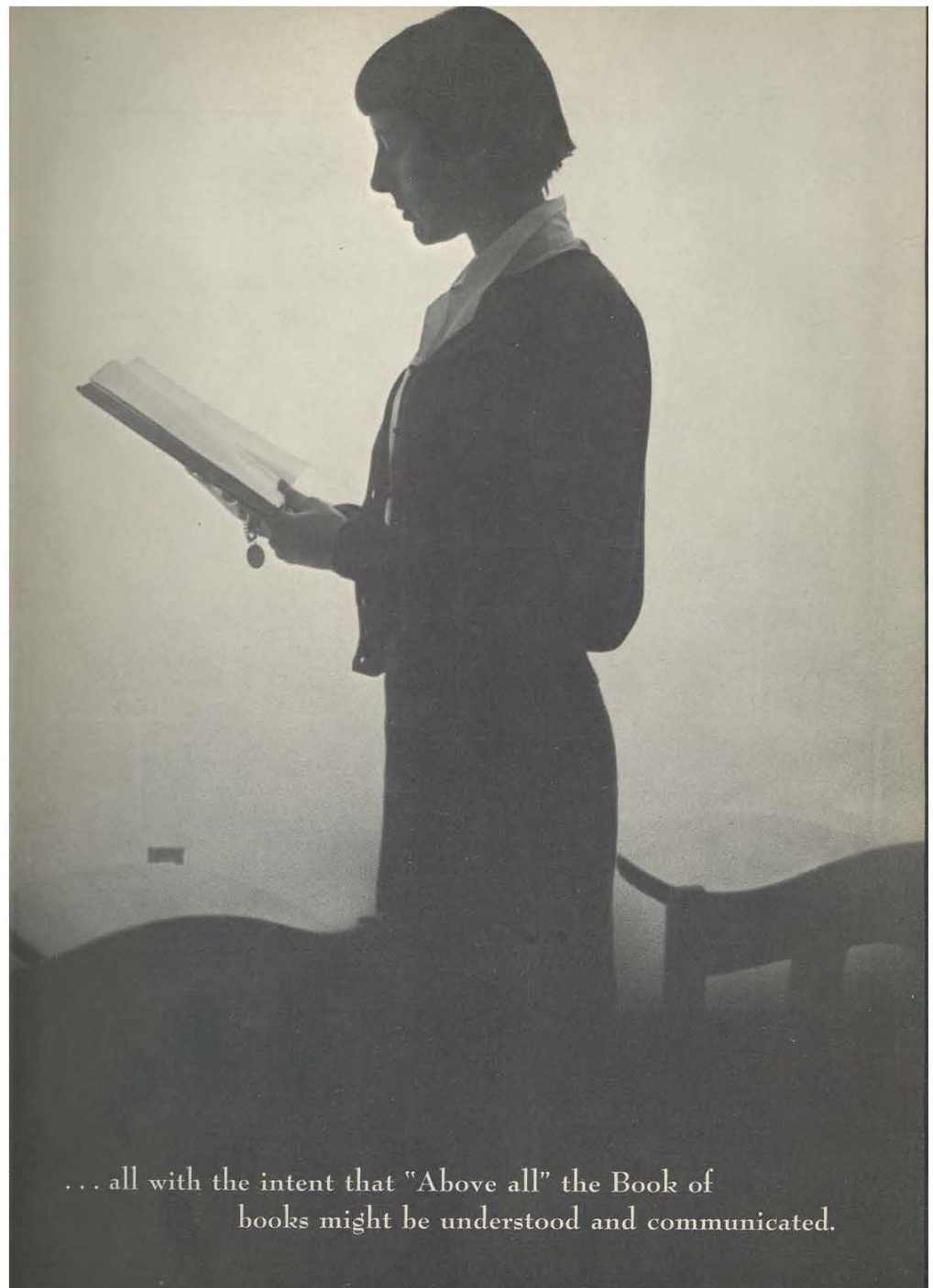


. . . from such discipline emerges a student in whose life

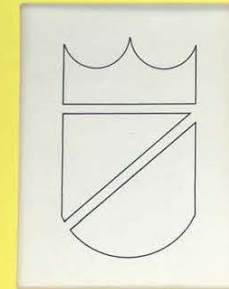

The missionary society officers, student-elected in the fall and spring, are responsible for the Friday night missionary meeting and . . .



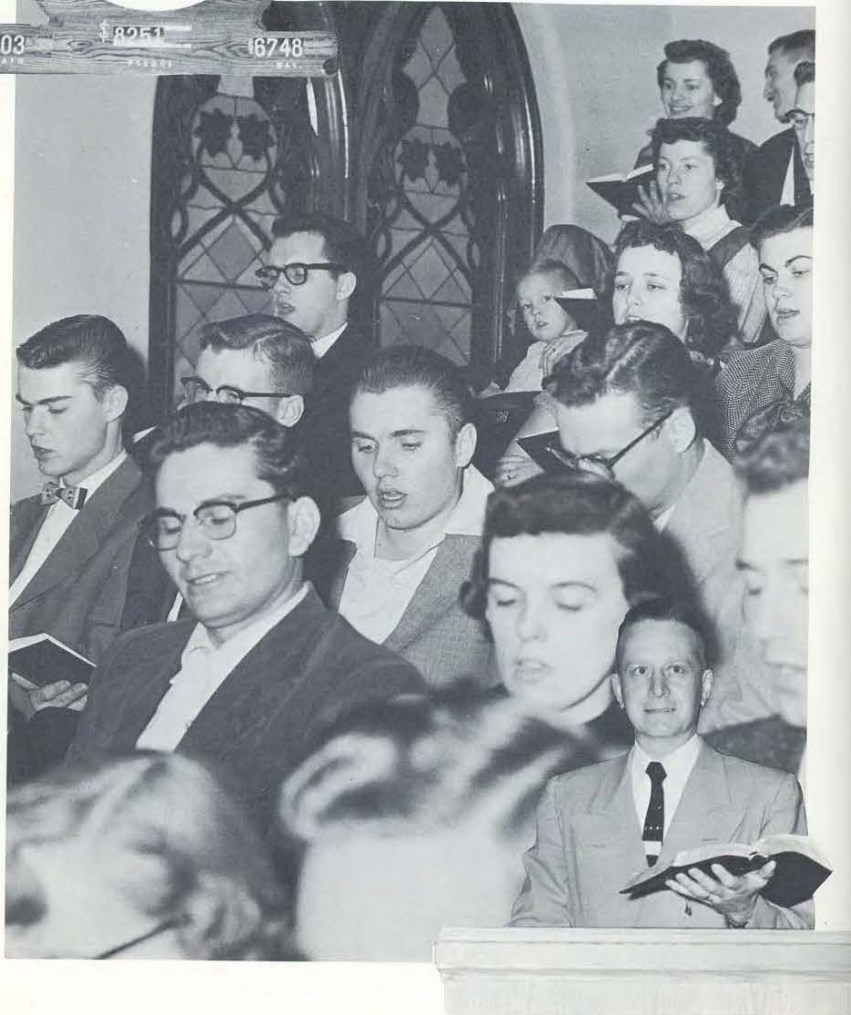
... for maintaining the missionary interest in the student body.

The high point of the day is chapel time. For the brief period of thirty minutes faculty, staff, and students gather to "Worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness".



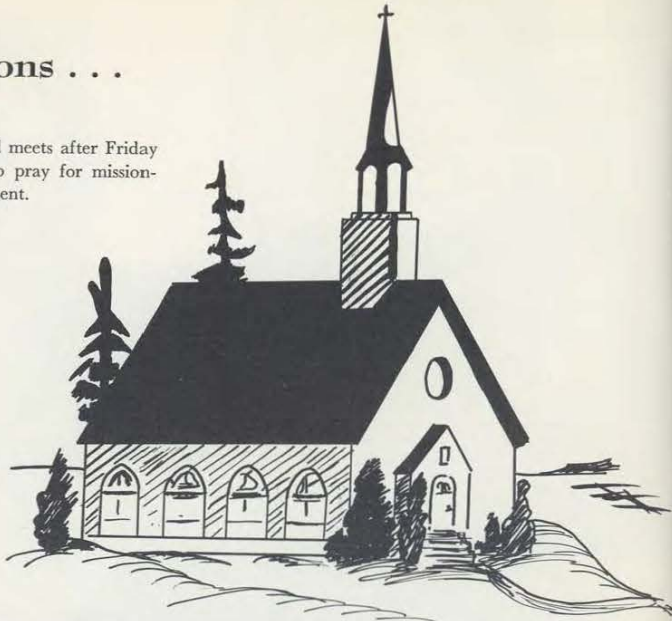

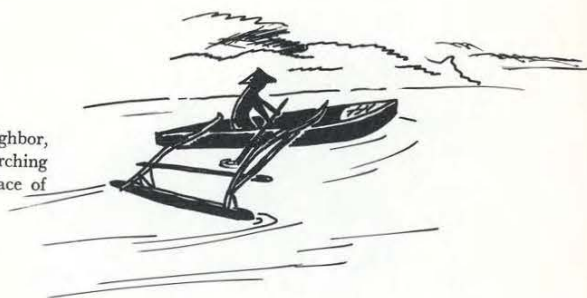

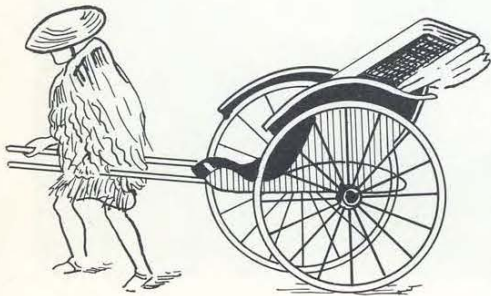

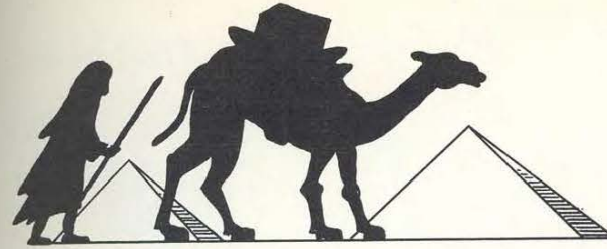

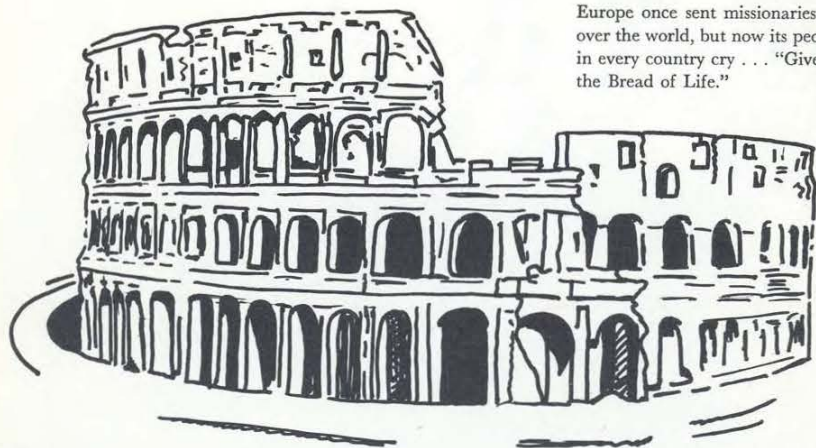

## World Missions Night

Missionary endeavor is a warfare. This sinister character of Godless forces is not to be underestimated. Local Church participation is a basic requirement for the success of missionary evangelism. The St. Paul Bible Institute through its annual World Missions Night, endeavors to stimulate an active interest in Missions. This program was begun many years ago as "Missionary Convocations" and was held in the old tabernacle when it stood. Then in the year 1946 a new step was taken that was to set the precedent for years to come. On February 12 of that year the S.P.B.I. students presented "World Missions Night" in the St. Paul Auditorium. The speaking was done by students and the Choral Club assisted in setting the musical background. It was such a challenge that many young men and women rose to their feet, at the conclusion of the program, to dedicate their lives to serve the Lord of the Harvest.

The program for 1957 was the twelfth annual presentation of World Missions Night. Large audiences viewed this year's program on Thursday night, March 28, at the St. Paul Auditorium and on Friday night, March 29, at the Minneapolis Auditorium.

### "Blood On

Newspaper headlines beginning Tuesday, January 11, 1956, and based on United Press reports, described in terse phrases the shocking news of the killing of five U. S. gospel-preaching missionaries by savage Auca Indians in Ecuador, South America.

These men who gave their lives were not impractical dreamers. They had had experience in dealing with savage Indians and fully realized the danger they faced. They took all the precautions they could and left the rest to God.

Five pierced bodies were strewn on the shore  
Some saw it tragedy — this, and no more,  
But some saw the triumph of that gallant band  
In the eloquent silence of blood on the sand.

Could we hear now their voices and dear faces see,  
They would say it was worth it — and we would agree.  
We remember the prayer and the final hour's talk —  
And the hymn that we sang — and the last quiet walk —  
Then the tender good-byes — and the wave of the hand  
As the plane zoomed aloft toward a dark jungle land

And we still know that God heard our prayer when we prayed;

For He knows our heartaches — understands every one;  
It was for the same cause that He gave His own Son.  
When we meet them again and their dear faces see,  
They will say it was worth it — and we will agree.

Could it be that the God-men our sickness could heal?

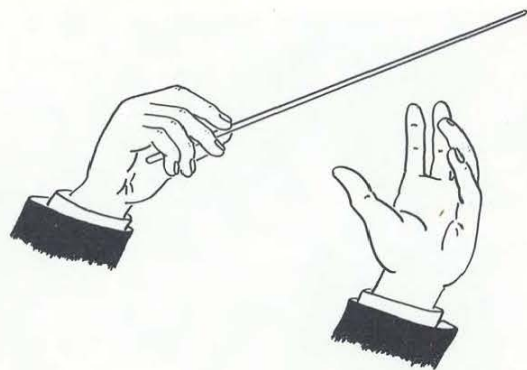
The white men spoke good — and they gave us good things:

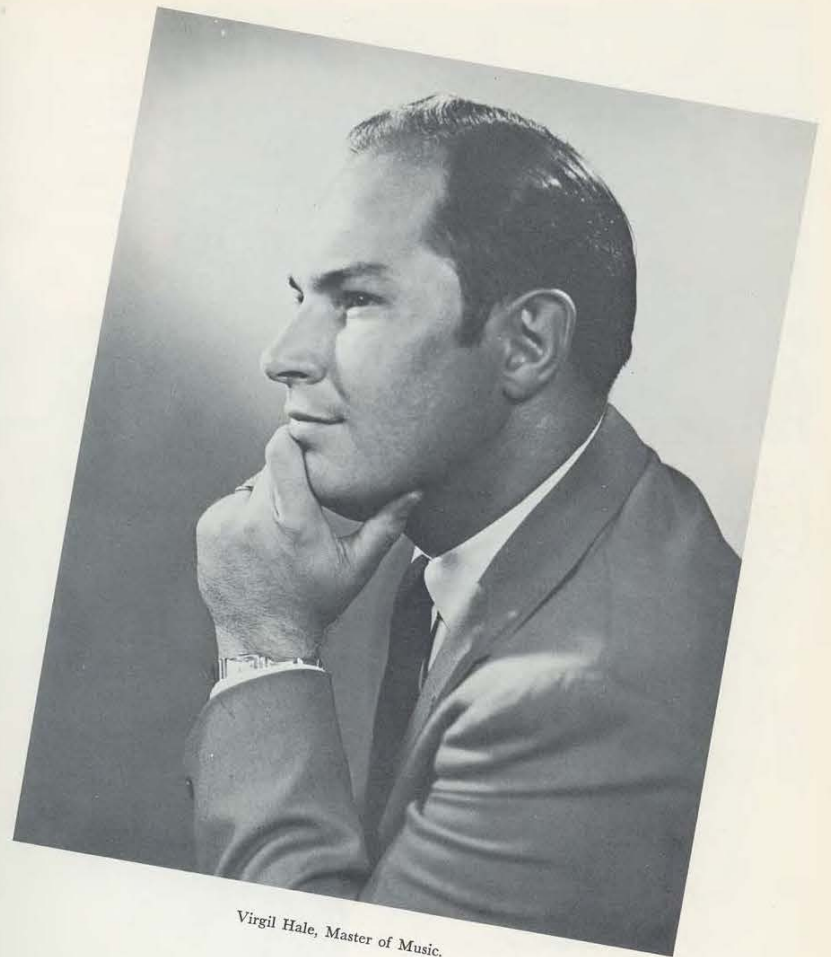

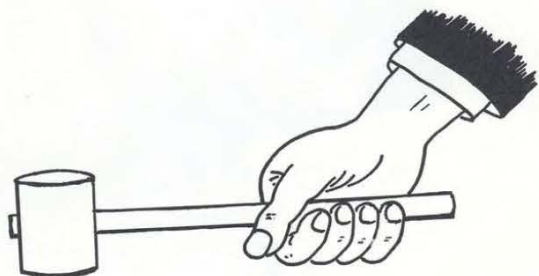

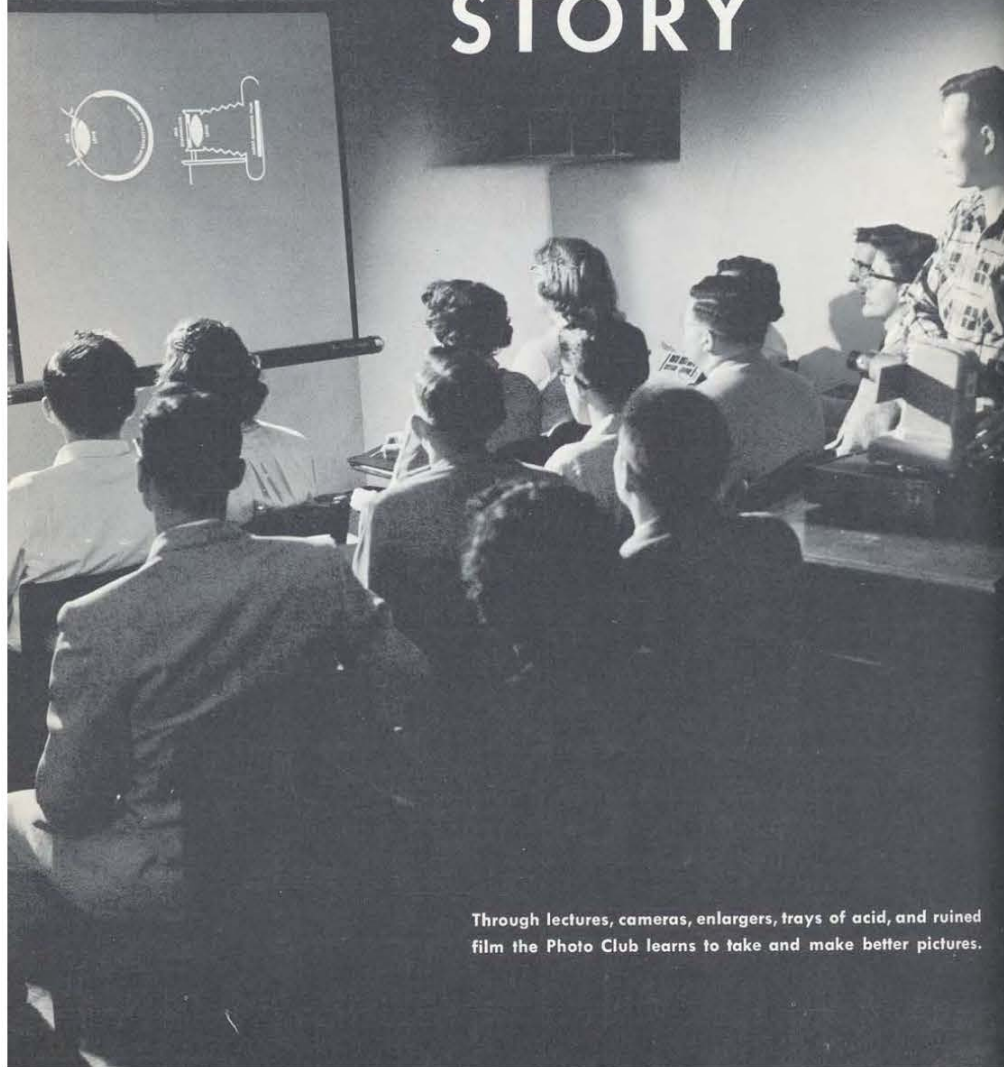

As the title implies, "Queen of the Stars" is named for a character in the play. The name Stella in the Indian Language means Queen of the Stars, but it is intended that the deeper significance of the symbolism of the title will unfold with the theme of the play.

"Queen of the Stars" is a simple play calculated to relate the story of a close-knit and seemingly self-sufficient family who were suddenly faced with a problem that to them seemed insurmountable. Their various reactions to what appeared to be a hopeless situation and the ultimate answer that they found, compromise the plot of the play. The family is typical of one with which we all might be acquainted, and though their problem is almost as old as the human race, still it never becomes commonplace to those who experience it. The author's family served as models for the Mitchell family, with the characters and events being, of course, modified to a considerable extent for dramatic production.
