

World Missions Night

Missionary endeavor is a warfare. This sinister character of Godless forces is not to be underestimated. Local Church participation is a basic requirement for the success of missionary evangelism. The St. Paul Bible Institute through its annual World Missions Night, endeavors to stimulate an active interest in Missions. This program was begun many years ago as "Missionary Convocations" and was held in the old tabernacle when it stood. Then in the year 1946 a new step was taken that was to set the precedent for years to come. On February 12 of that year the S.P.B.I. students presented "World Missions Night" in the St. Paul Auditorium. The speaking was done by students and the Choral Club assisted in setting the musical background. It was such a challenge that many young men and women rose to their feet, at the conclusion of the program, to dedicate their lives to serve the Lord of the Harvest.

The program for 1957 was the twelfth annual presentation of World Missions Night. Large audiences viewed this year's program on Thursday night, March 28, at the St. Paul Auditorium and on Friday night, March 29, at the Minneapolis Auditorium.

"Blood On The Sand"

Newspaper headlines beginning Tuesday, January 11, 1956, and based on United Press reports, described in terse phrases the shocking news of the killing of five U. S. gospel-preaching missionaries by savage Auca Indians in Ecuador, South America.

These men who gave their lives were not impractical dreamers. They had had experience in dealing with savage Indians and fully realized the danger they faced. They took all the precautions they could and left the rest to God.

Five pierced bodies were strewn on the shore Some saw it tragedy — this, and no more, But some saw the triumph of that gallant band In the eloquent silence of blood on the sand.

Could we hear now their voices and dear faces see, They would say it was worth it — and we would agree. We remember the prayer and the final hour's talk — And the hymn that we sang — and the last quiet walk — Then the tender good-byes — and the wave of the hand As the plane zoomed aloft toward a dark jungle land 'Til the ship was a bird — then a fleck soaring high; How it disappeared into vast endless sky.

But soon on that short wave their voices we heard; There was anticipation in each eager word. The reports were all good and the venture going well; That our husbands were happy and thrilled — we could tell

The natives had met them with friendship, they said. Then all of a sudden — the radio went dead . . .

The hours of waiting and worry are through; Their bodies were found — there was no more to do. By death or by life they would preach Christ to save; And the field of their mission was also their grave . .

We are lonely and tired, but we are not dismayed, And we still know that God heard our prayer when we prayed:

For He knows our heartaches — understands every one: It was for the same cause that He gave His own Son. When we meet them again and their dear faces see, They will say it was worth it — and we will agree.

The white men were hurt — but they hurt no one here . . .

Still they looked on us softly, and they seemed without fear;

And we heard them say "Jesus!" He must be their king.

How I wish that we knew Him and what He could bring.

Could it be that their brothers may come to us here And take from our hearts this great burden of fear; And tell us some more of that wonderful Name? We wait . . . and we wait . . . Are we waiting in vain? On the back of a great hummingbird they came: And ever since then, we are never the same.

Hence the martyrs who fell without fighting or strife,


And the power of the Gospel spread far o'er the earth


