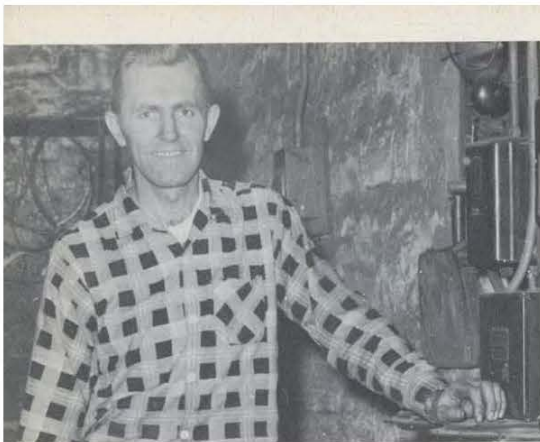

Comprehended not his gain . . .

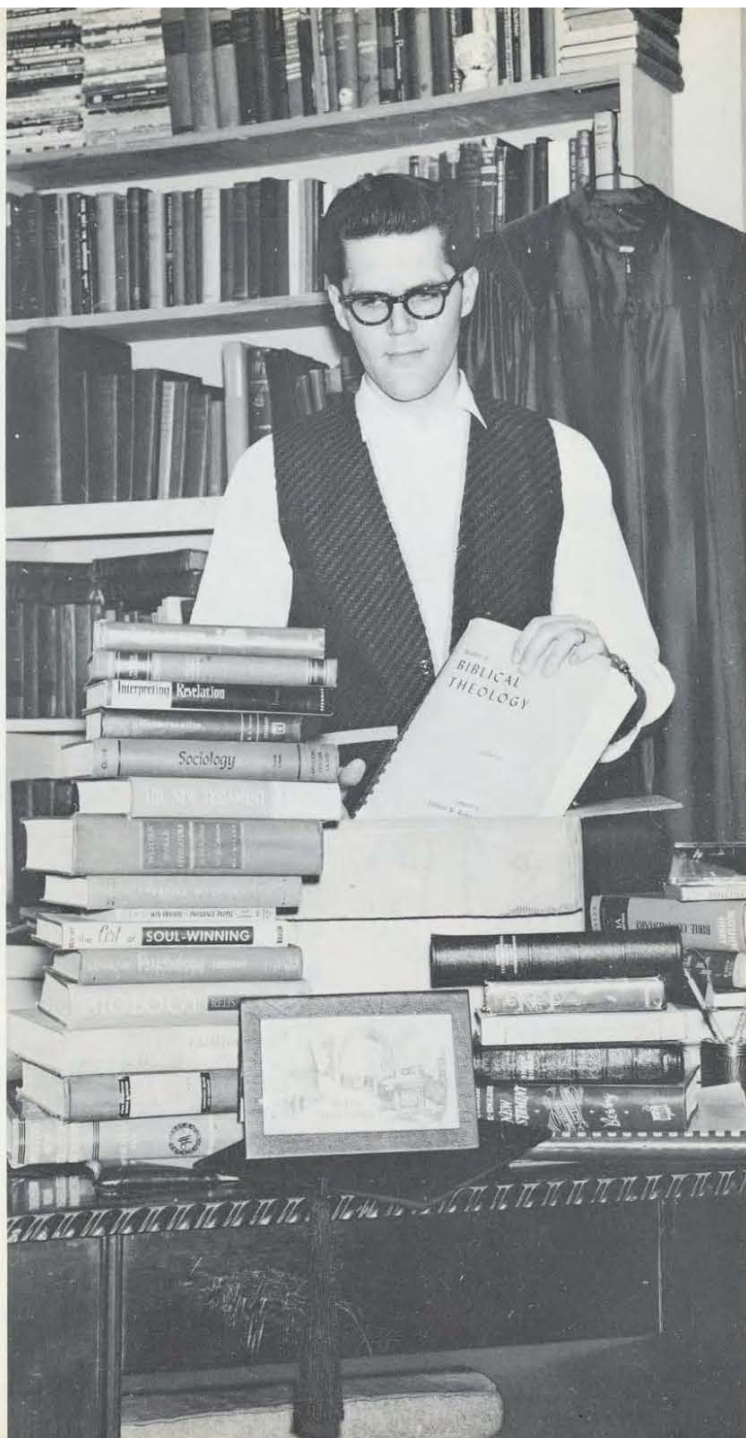
For the music of Christ coming,

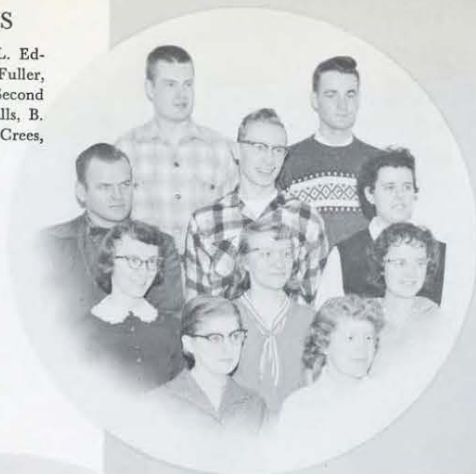
