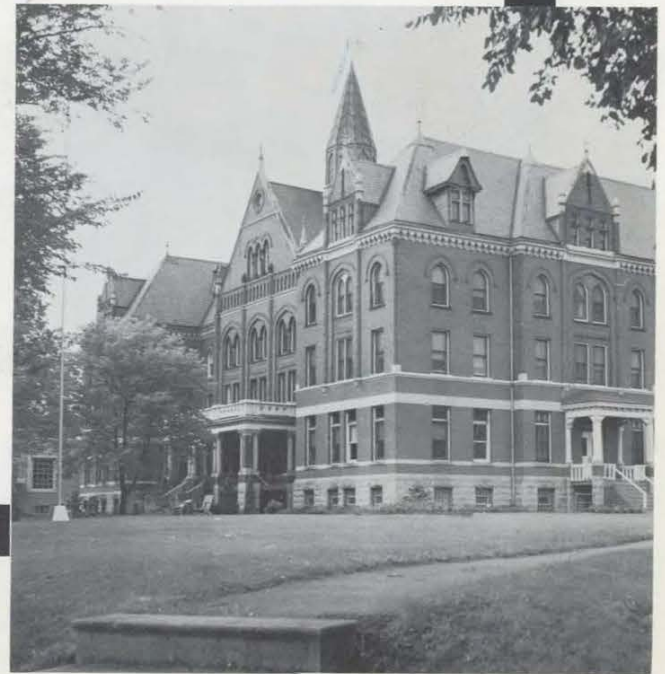

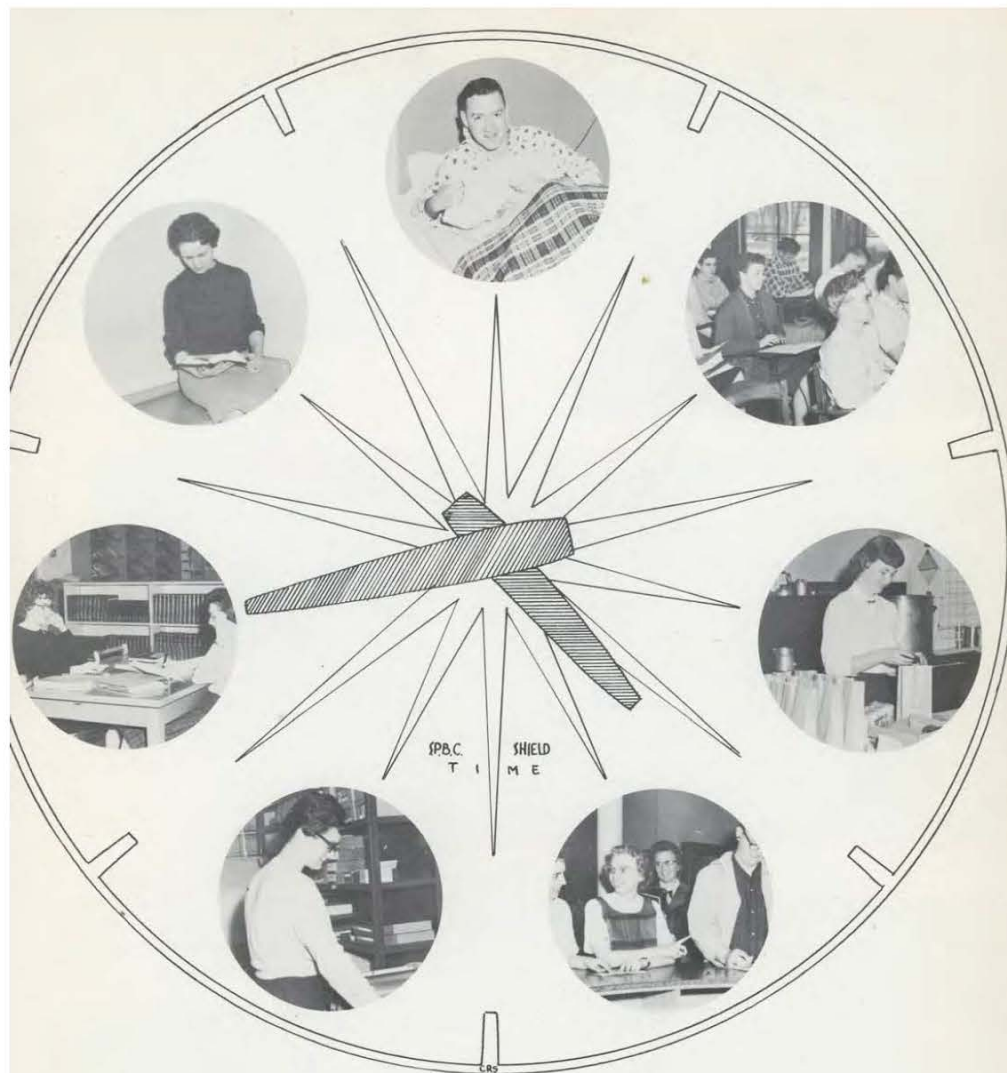

No matter what hour of the day you look in on the students of S.P.B.C. you will find them busily engaged in one activity or another.

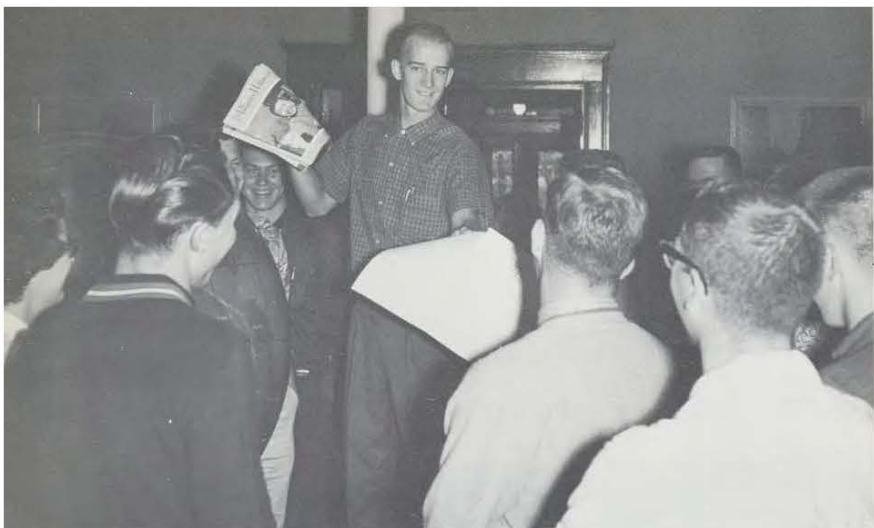

West Pakistan
February 26, 1961

Dear Rev. Hardwick:

Garhi Habibullah is just a dot on Pakistan maps - and isn't even noted on other maps of importance. It is a village of quite a few houses, however, and therefore a strategic spot for mission work, especially since Azad Kashmir closed to mission work in February of last year. We are situated just three miles from that border, on the Pakistan side. The village is situated very prettily on the side of the Kunhar River in a narrow valley. In the early morning and in the evening, when the noise of the day dies away, we can hear the music of the rushing water.

Just today, a woman who has been quite interested in the Gospel came into our courtyard with "something special". She had made a special roll just for us - a good equivalent to poppy seed rolls there in the U. S. It was delicious! But imagine her surprise - and mine - when the "something special" turned out to be a piece of paper in which the poppy seed roll was wrapped! I had noticed that it was a heavier sort of paper, with pictures of young people on it. Then she went out to get some of the poppy seeds for us, for we had shown interest in them. The paper she brought the seeds back in was the same sort of paper - and I looked at it more closely, and to my surprise, saw Florence Ohm's picture on it, and Carol Meacham's name. I asked her where the book was, wondering if it could possibly be a copy of the SHIELD that had found its way up north here - literally in the "sticks".

She showed the way to a small shop where they were using the paper to wrap up flour, seeds, sugar and various other things for their customers. The man at first was afraid, for he thought that he had done some wrong, but after I showed him the pictures of the people I recognized, then he produced the remainder of the book - and it was a SHIELD - 1960! I have struck a bargain with the man to "buy" the remains of the book from him - I will bring the book to him, along with some other paper, and will give him the equal weight of the paper in the book in old magazines that I have around the house.

I was thrilled to see again a copy of the SHIELD - the first one I had seen since graduating in 1956. It was a joy to see the pictures of the buildings again, and the faces of the dear men and women of God under whose instruction it was my privilege to sit. Many pages of the book are missing, but even then I did see about ten students who were in school at the time I was. I think all of those I would have recognized graduated with the class of '60, however.

I thought that you would be interested in hearing how at least one SHIELD ended up. I am thrilled with the little surprises the Lord gives along the way!

May the Lord bless each one of you.
