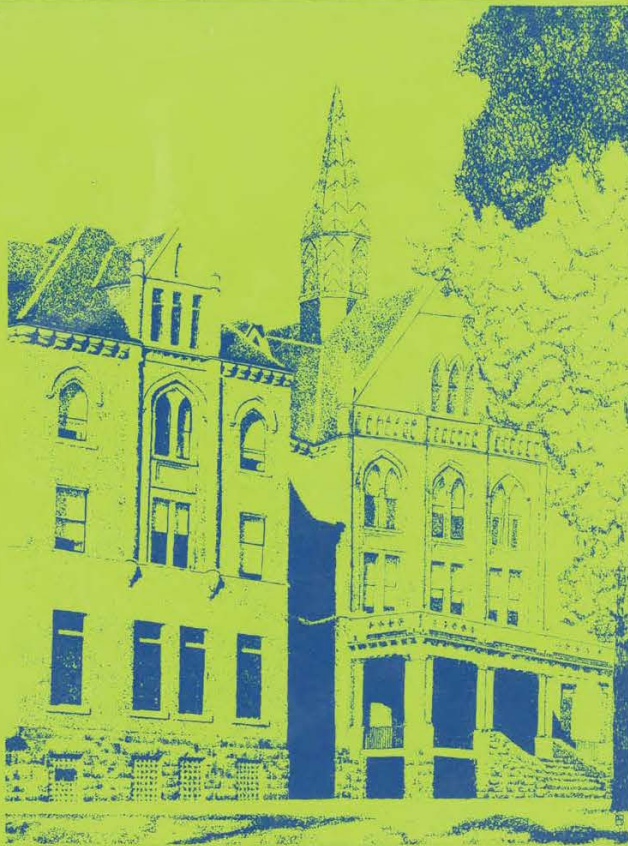

We must move on.

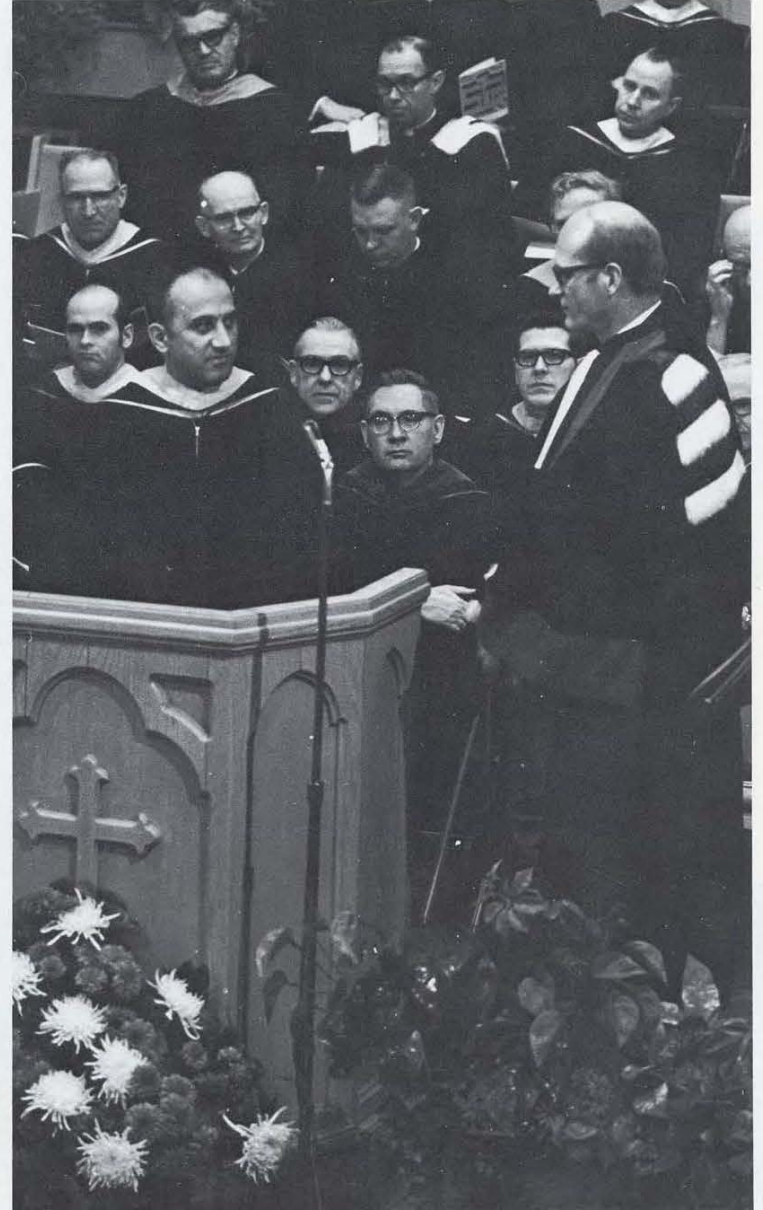






#### The Past Year

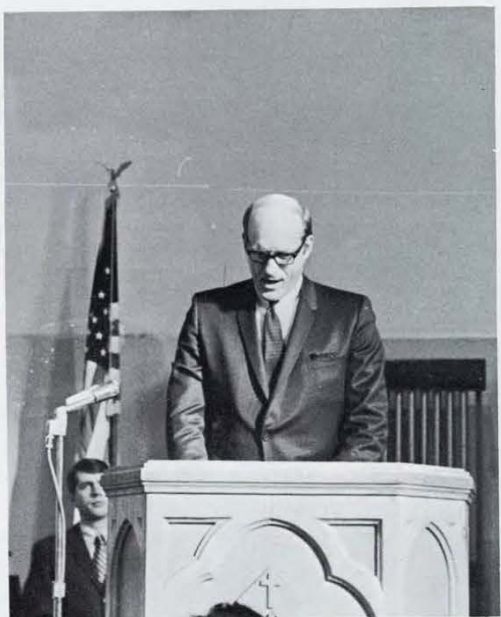


## Spiritual Renewal Sought As New President Comes To St. Paul Bible College

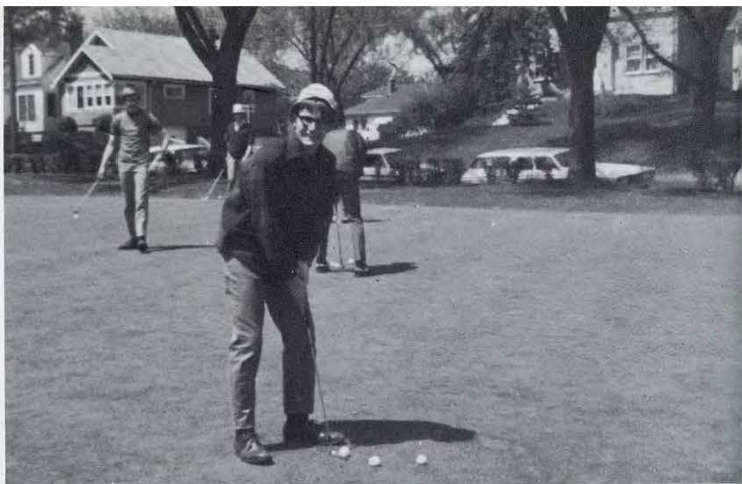


## Cheerleaders Share Victories and Pain With Crusaders

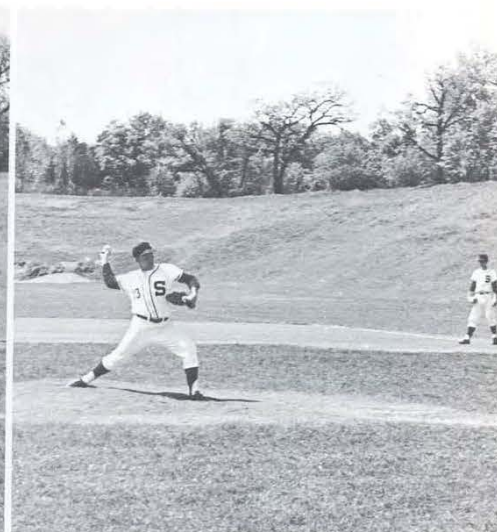
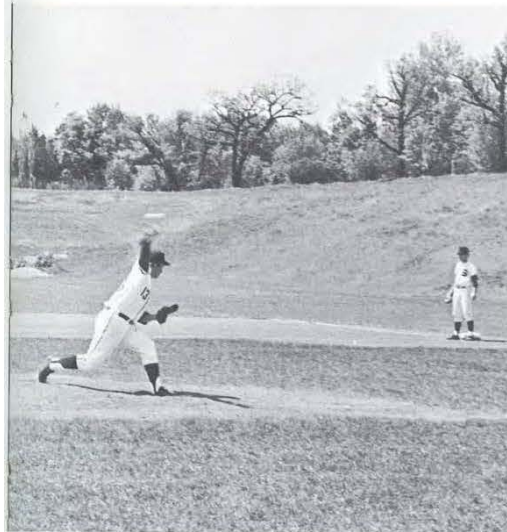
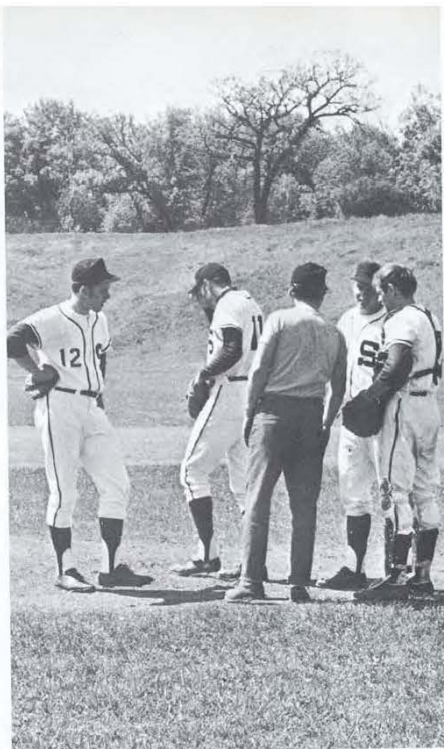


## Duffers Massacre Como Greens

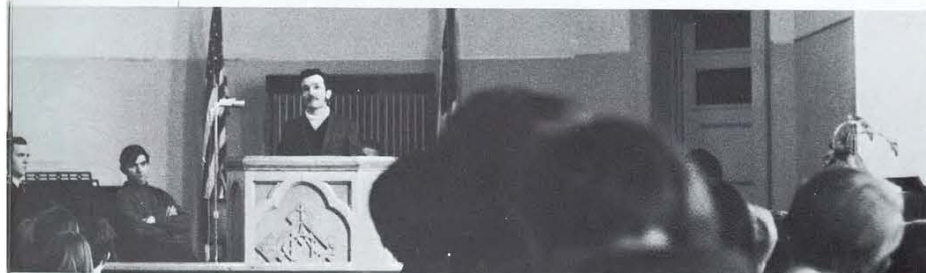

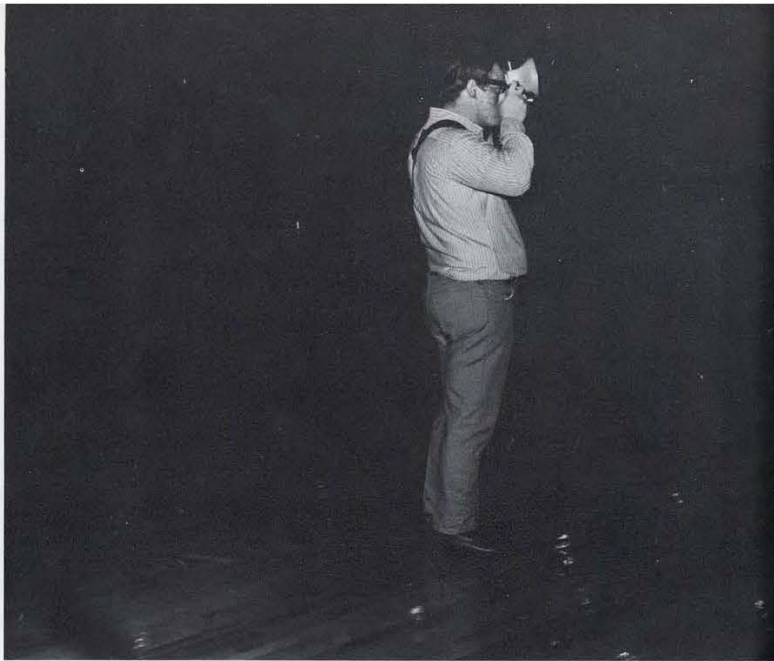

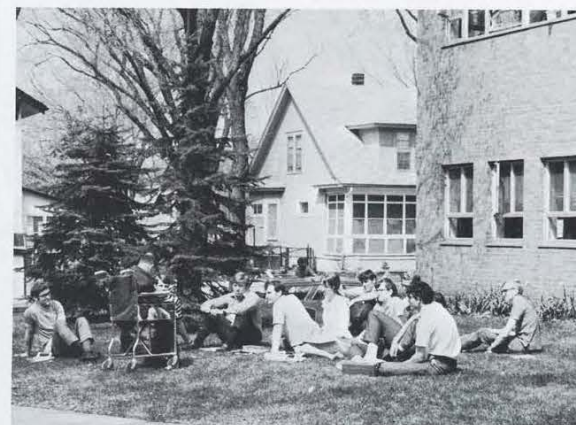


## Science Prof Sees Missions Ahead

Doc Gates smiles a lot. His philosophy must be worth studying. He also teaches some Bible courses and comparative religion within his departmental curriculum.

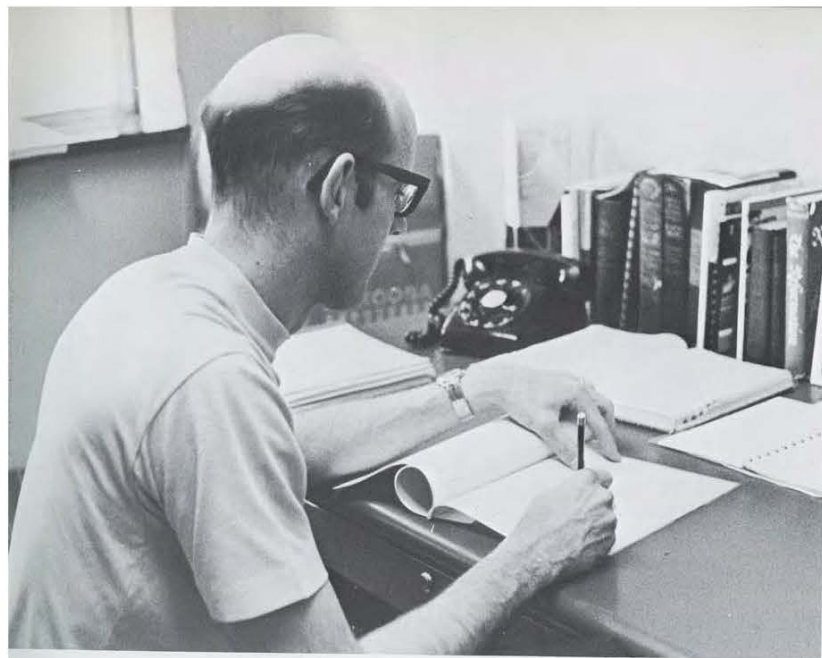
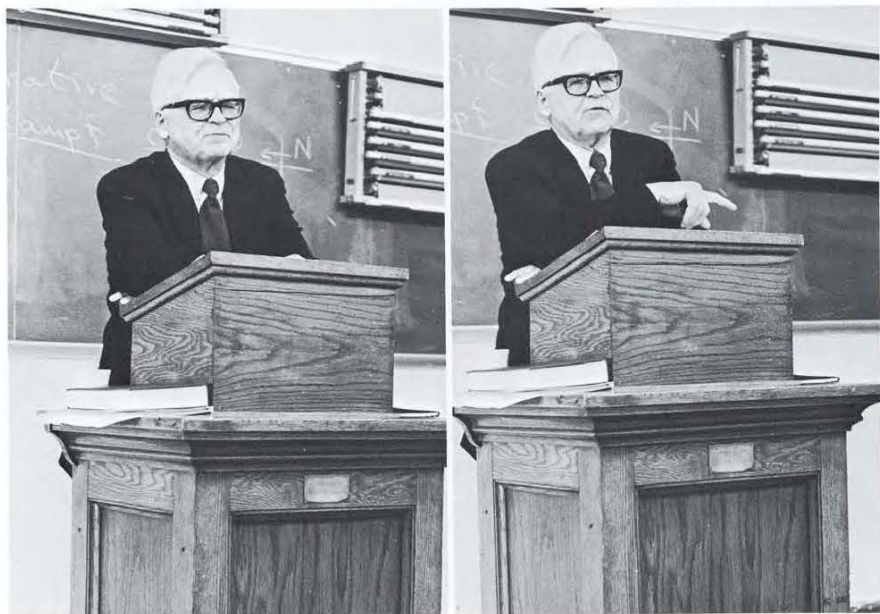






Spring fever attacks right about the time SPBC students should be studying for finals. Most of us try to make the best of both; and most of us find the history books more often closed than open.

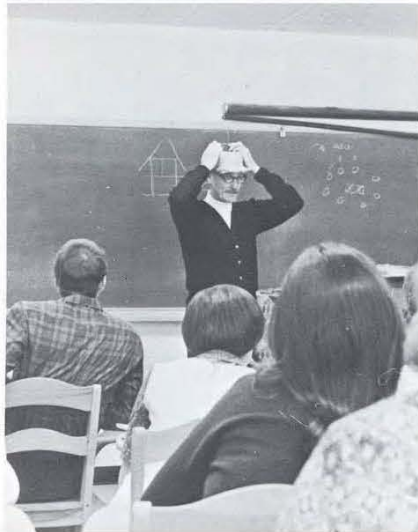

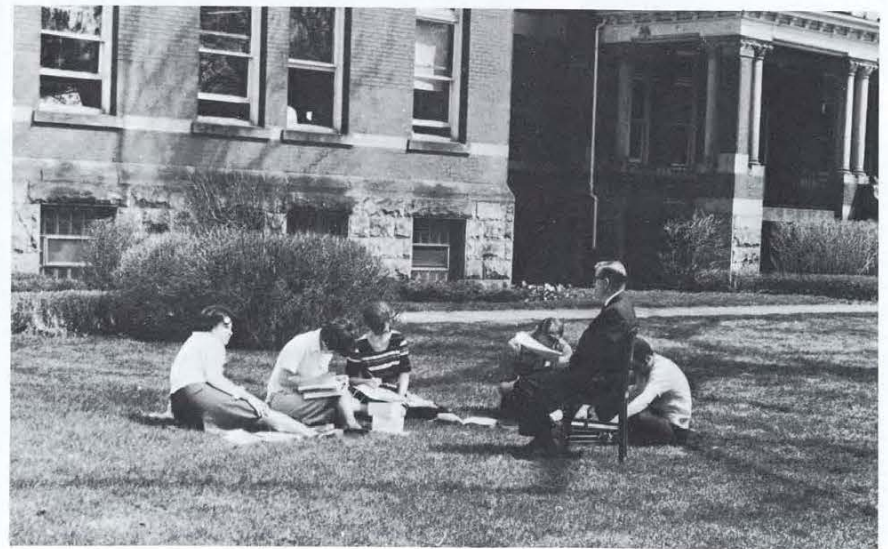
