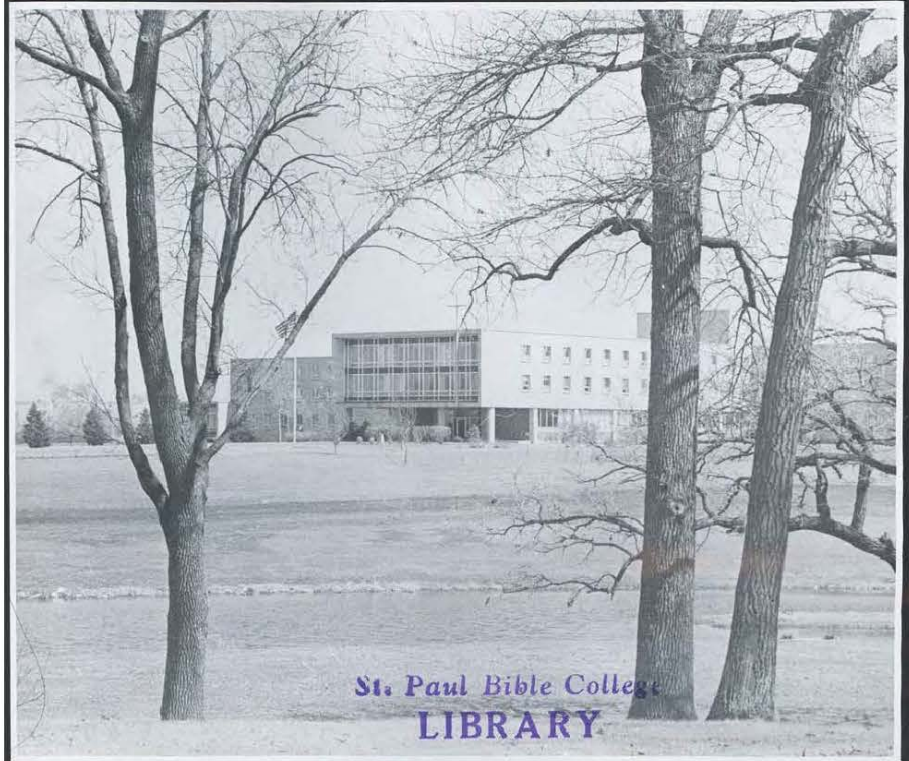

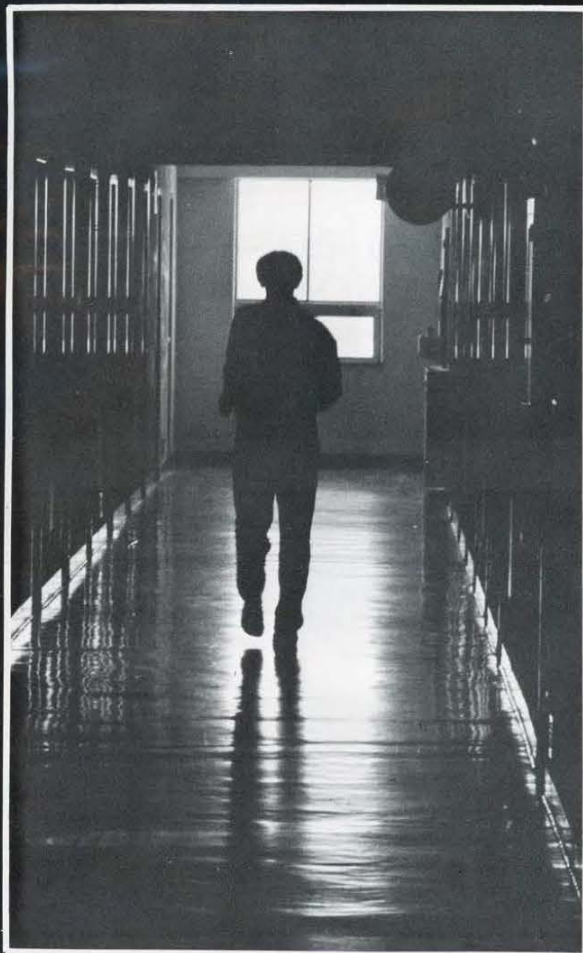

Elmer Case ...

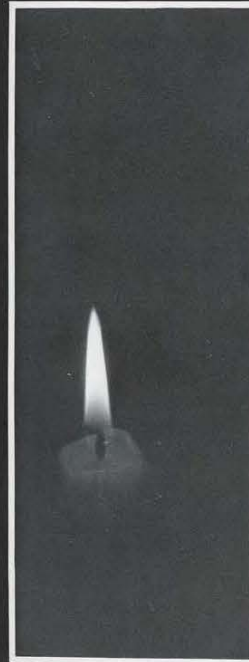

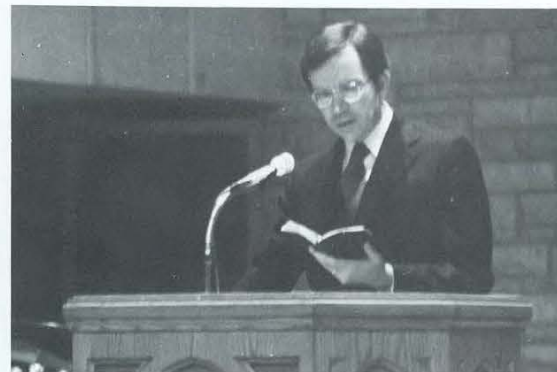

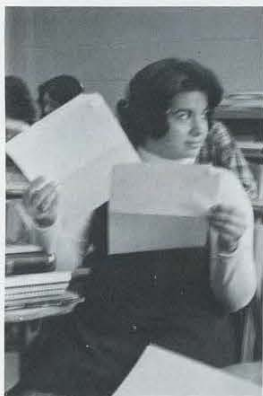

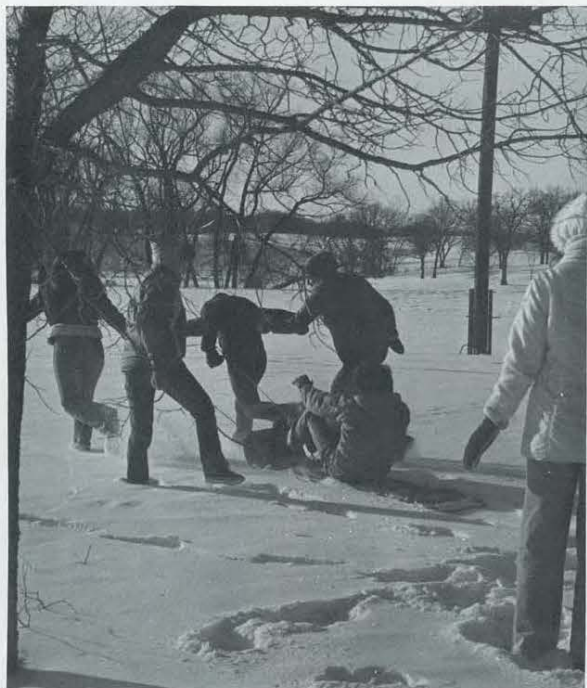

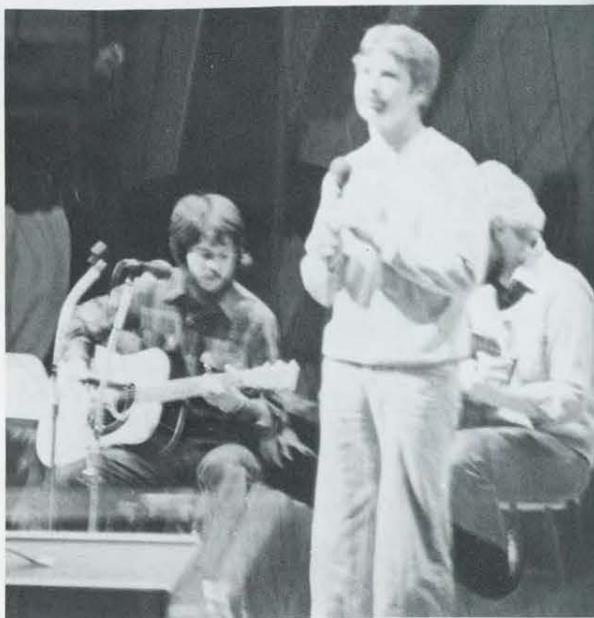

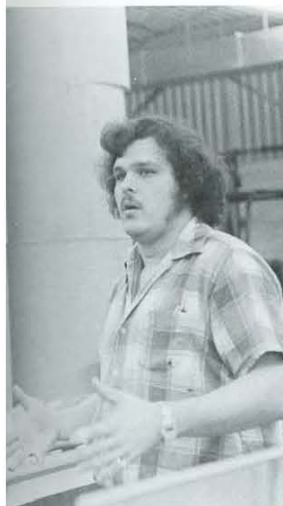

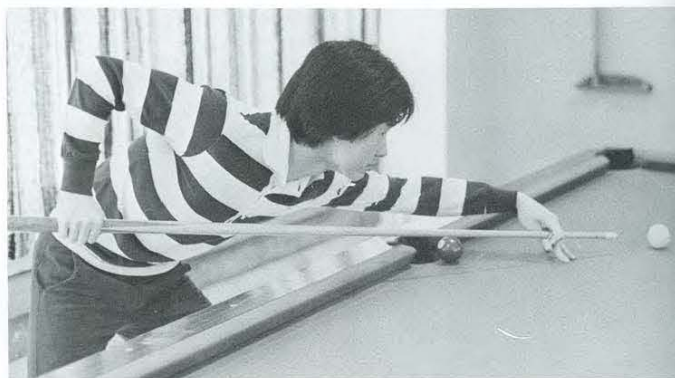

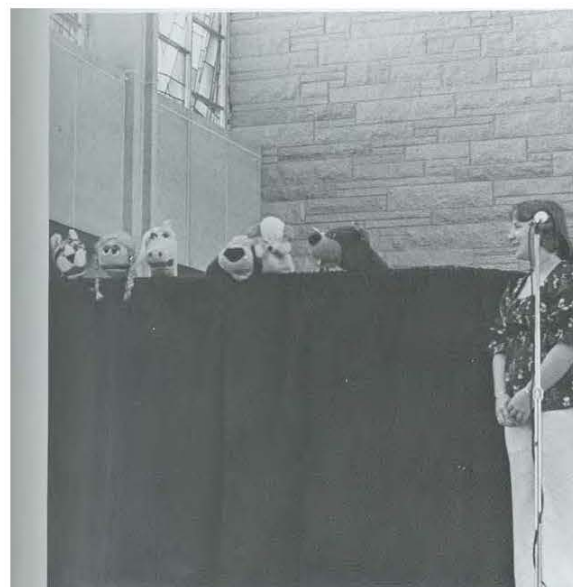

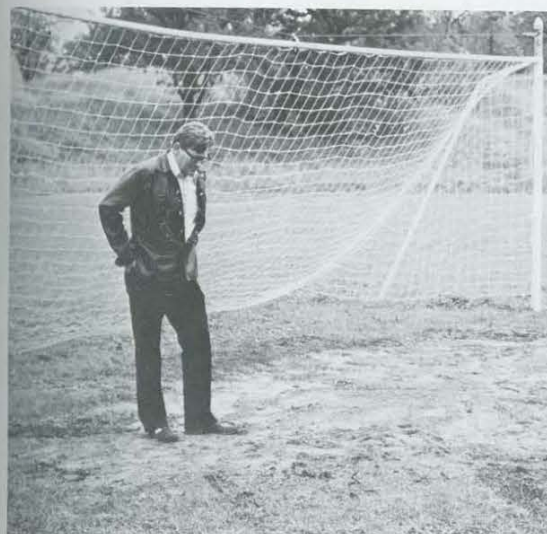

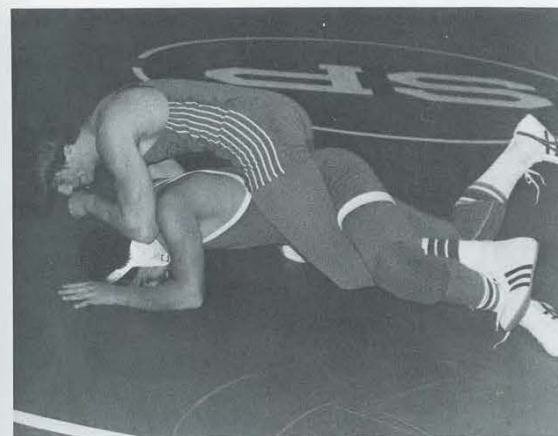
