





















Free to be what I am with the goal of becoming what God intended me to be.




People are SPBC. Each individual associated with SPBC contributes an integral part of the total institution.

Students work to pay SPBC bill



As followers of Jesus Christ, the Crusader athletes testify to the character-building capacity of collegiate sports. Each game can be a refiner's fire.

Discipline. Volleyball or soccer, cross-country or tennis, all can be tools for the transforming work of God in our lives. Everyone involved, from head-coach to waterboy, can participate in what Athletic Director Bud Pierce calls a "Praise Performance."

The year got off to a running start with the Crusader Co-ed cross-country cavalcade. This sprightly entourage jogged its way to a 7-12 season, and saw Dan Jones blaze his way to a new SPBC course record. (The arson charges were dropped).

Another group of men, SPBC's pride and joy, spent the fall scurrying across a four-sided plot of grass. The Crusader soccer squad performed this elemental task extremely well, finishing the year at 17-6-1, going all the way to the District Four NCCAA Tournament championship game. The loss there precluded further "Nationals" play.

Men and women's basketball encountered a few interesting situations. The women found themselves playing Augsburg College in the Mets Sports Center. The men played in a Texas tournament, and finished second in the MRCC tourney.

The spring saw the inauguration of women's softball. Men's baseball and tennis also filled the schedule. When not battling their opponents, these three squads were struggling with the springtime weather. It can be hard work.
