Classes in the History Department span from studying ancient civilizations to studying current elections in Contemporary History to studying the foundations of the modern church in Church History.







By the time February rolls around, few people care to celebrate the presence of snow. SNOW DAYS is an excellent means of breaking the monotony of long Minnesota winters.




The Lion, The Witch, and The Wardrobe










Mary stated, "We couldn't have asked for a better group. We hated to see the school year end, but it'll be great to see them all when they get back." These students will share their missionary experiences with the student body when they return in August.



Returning runners from last year were Tom Hatch, Kirk Daniell, Tom Milford and Burke.



Coach Janis Runka, saw his pre-season expectations fulfilled as the team recuperated from early injuries to finish with a winning record for the fourth consecutive year.



Often the was hardly room, in the bleachers to accomodate the band. But the musicians showed up faithfully and with the help of the cheerleaders kept the awesome crowds under control.

















