



"I Will Dwell in the House of the Lord Forever"



Nanette Phebus accepted the Lord as her Saviour in 1978 and enrolled at St. Paul Bible College that fall where she pursued a major in Christian Education.

She spent her first summer as a student at Camp Forest Springs managing their craft shop. She enjoyed teaching crotchet. Her next summer was spent in Japan with the Scrum Dendo team, Language Institute for Evangelism. She liked the Japanese culture and hoped on returning. In the summer of '82 she completed her Christian Education internship at Waconia Alliance Church and became the superintendent of the Sunday school programs there in the fall.

Nanette completed the requirements for a bachelor's in Christian Education and had several classes left to complete her minor in Christian counseling when on August 11, 1983 she went to be with the Lord. She would have graduated summa cum laude.

It was Nanette's love for the outdoors, her enjoyment of education and being intellectually challenged, and her philosophy of life, which included a ministry for the disabled, that characterized her as being a truely special people pleasing person.

A Witness for the Lord

Connie Grandy enrolled in St. Paul Bible College in the fall of 1980 with the intentions of becoming a missionary nurse.

It was just four years ago that Connie found out that she had cancer. The doctors believed she would have to lose a leg to cancer but only the hip ball, twelve inches of bone, and the tumor were removed and replaced with stainless steel parts.

Chemotherapy, interferon, and radiation treatments were a part of Connie's life, but the last few months of her life she decided against any kind of treatments.

"Connie believed that it was the Lord's will for her

"Connie believed that it was the Lord's will for her illness and that something good would come out of it," said SPBC student Terri Grandy, niece of Connie.

According to her brother, Dave Grandy, SPBC's building and grounds superintendent, Connie had used her illness to be a witness for the Lord. "If this is how He wants to use her -- she's given her life to Him... It's really precious how the Lord has given her the ability to cope with it." He also added that Connie has used conversations about her condition to point non-Christians to the cross.

On January 5, 1984, Connie went home to be with the Lord she had given her life to.

"Connie was an inspiration to all who knew her. Through her actions she taught me not to let life get you down; take what you have, keep on going. Use your talents for the Lord and don't let them go to waste," reflected Terri Grandy.








Letting Christ Shine Through Us



The cross country team wore new uniforms this fall - bright gold, white and purple - and ran to a mark of 9 wins and 11 losses, with an 8 and 0 record in the conference. The high point of the season was winning the NICC tournament at Ellendale, ND. A good spirit of Christian fellowship was enjoyed by competitors at the conference meet and throughout the season among team members who used their running ability to honor Christ

The Crusaders participated in meets or road races every Saturday through September and October. Competition in the Twin Cities area was demanding. Todd Burke, the team's number one runner, completed his senior year running the fastest time on the home course by a SPBC runner since 1978 — 28:52 over 5 miles of difficult, hilly terrain around the campus.













When the festivities were over a hayride put the perfect finishing touch on the sophomore sponsored Harvest Fest.





Under the direction of president Jeff Olson, the junior class put together a Mexican Fiesta that was fun, unique, and very well prepared.



In keeping away from the usual romantic type ban-quet the Fiesta proved to be a time of pure fun and fellowship for all.






