




So, bitter feelings aside, I hope that you enjoy the flavor that the Purple Storm adds to this book and its new name, The Storm Tracker.






The Nineteenth Annual Christmas in Crown Chapel



The 2001 season was a tough one for the young and inexperienced Storm volleyball team. With only three players back from the 2000 squad and four freshmen in the starting line-up, Crown struggled to find a rhythm on the court. The Stormen the season with an 8-18 overall record but competed strongly against NCCAA schools and won several games with-in the Na Upper Midwest Athletic Conference.


The team had two players nominated to the NCCAA North Central All Region Team. Sophomore Outside Hitter, Sara Kurka was honored with First Team All Region status while Sophomore Setter, Kristin Harris, made Second Team. In addition the Storm had two players chosen to the UMAC All Conference Team. Kurka and Freshman Outside Hitter, Rachel Landed were both chosen as Honorable Mentions to the All Conference Team.

Despite the lack of wins the 2001 team had a bond that survived through all the tough losses. "I have coached very fe teams who have enjoyed being together so much. They never let the lack of wins effect their love of the game or their relationships with each other off the court," stated Coach Manninen. "It made the season a great experience for the coach staff."

The team will only graduate one senior, so with a year of experience behind them the future looks bright for the Storm.

A Typhoon of Take-aways

Despite their struggles to reach the win column, the Purple Storm continued to improve in each game of the season. Although the team was young (only six seniors), Crown stayed competitive and lost four games by less than a touchdown. Critical tumovers plagued the Storm all year and prevented chances of winning.

The Storm Defense shattered the school record for take-aways (interceptions and fumble recoveries) by recording 41 for the season. Sophomore Free Safety Ryan Greenberg set the pace with seven interceptions. Junior Linebacker Kyle Strickfaden led the defense with 82 tackles, while Senior Linebacker Burt Holloway and Sophmore Defensive Lineman David Chadwick recorded 5 sacks each. The defense will only get better, with eight starters returning and the addition of a strong recruiting class for 2002.

With the addition of an entirely new offensive system, the Storm struggled early in the season. However, the Offense continued to improve and executed better at the end of the season. Sophmore Running Back J.T. Trotter rushed for 1000 yards for the first time in school history, which makes him Crown's All-Time Leading Rusher. Receivers Seth Parise and Bill Bedford each led the team with 23 receptions. The Offense came together over the last five games and became a quality


The Crown College Women's Basketball Team ended their season with a loss to Martin Luther College in UMAC play-offs on February 19, 2002. The previous weekend the team advanced to the Championship Round of the Regional Tournament but lost in an exciting overtime game to North Central University. The loss gave the Crown women a second place standing in the North Central Region of the NCCAA for the season.

Crown had a first round bye after earning the second place seed for the Regional Tournament due to their strong regular season record. The Storm met up with Trinity Bible College in the second round of the tournament on Friday, February 15. Crown began slow and fell behind 6-2 before settling down. Crown gradually took charge of the first half and entered the locker room with a 20point cushion, leading 39-19 at the half.

Crown continued to dominate in the second half and eventually cruised to the 67-36 win over the Trinity Bible College Lions. Crown was led by Joylin Womeldorf, who scored 26 points and pulled down 10 rebounds for the game. Sara Kurka put up some strong numbers also with 20 points and 8 rebounds. Kasey Pust had 10 points and Becky Krats had 4 points, 6 assists, and 3 steals for the night.

On Saturday, February 16, Crown faced off against top seeded North Central University in the Championship Game of the Regional Tournament. The North Central Rams started strong and held the lead for the entire first half entering the locker room with the slim, 43-37 lead. Both teams sho over 60% in the half.

Crown jumped out quickly in the second half with a 6-0 run to tie the game at 43. The contest became a dogfight with neither team being able to get an advantage. Toward the end of the half. the Storm finally took a slight lead. With 17 seconds left on the clock Crown had possession of the ball and a three-point lead. Great defense by the Rams created a turnover, and Kati Shea of North Central University hit a clutch shot with two seconds left to keep her team alive and push the gaminto overtime, 68-68. 




