GIT News

GIT's biggest emphasis of the first semester was hosting the Missions Festival. Classes were cancelled for most of this 3 day festival so students could attend activities and seminars focused on missions. The speaker for the Festival was Nard Puyao, a native of Papua New Guinea, who was saved through the work of missionaries. He eventually became a pilot with Wycliffe Bible Translators. A Mongolian Ger prayer tent was set up, a concert planned, a night game called "Persecution" played out, times of prayer for the nations facilitated, the annual Faculty vs. Student soccer competed in, and the first ever Globe Trekking event created during which classrooms were transformed into several different regions of the world to provide an intercultural-like experience for faculty and students.

GIT's focus for second semester was Crown's Missions Project. This year the campus raised money to sponsor the college tuition of three handicapped students graduating from an orphanage in China. The rarity of an orphan being able to go to college matched with the greater rarity of a person with physical handicaps being able to go to college made this project unique. All three of the sponsored students plan to use their education to bless the world with the love of Christ.

GIT also sponsored prayer bands (groups of students who meet weekly to intercede for the nations) throughout the semesters, planned approximately 3 chapels per month, and hosted several missions-related events over the course of the school year.

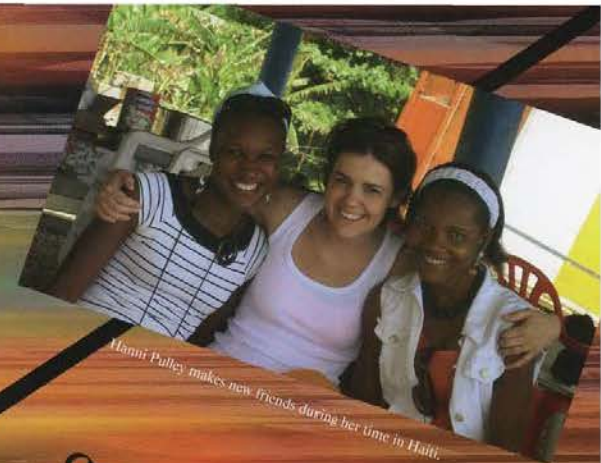

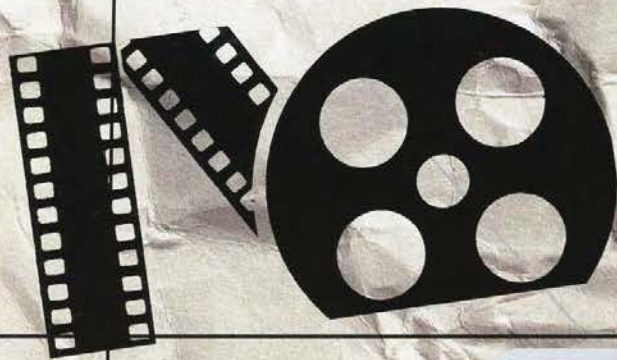

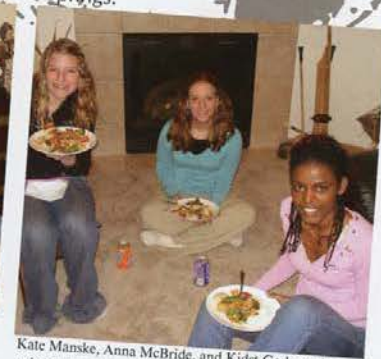

SIFE

The 2007-2008 school year brought SIFE (Student Involvement Enterprise) back to Crown after an absence of nearly ten years. Business professor Tim Blanchard, new to the faculty team in 2006, played a huge role in bringing the club back for a very successful year. Upon coming to Crown, he was already a pre-approved SIFE advisor, and part of the reason Crown brought him on was to get the SIFE program at Crown up and running once again. The year started slowly with only five club members, but by second semester, membership grew to over fifteen people.

SIFE's main project for the year was creating a compilation CD featuring Crown students and staff that was sold to fund the rest of events for the year. Other projects included organizing mock interview opportunities for students on campus, hosting a seminar instructing students on the importance of their credit, and tutoring women involved in an inner city extension of Crown, The Promise Program.

At the end of the year, SIFE students brought together the information from the events they completed and created an annual report that was turned into a twenty-four minute presentation to be presented at the regional SIFE competition in Minneapolis. Crown's rookie team was not expected to do very well in the competition, but the team surprised both competitors and judges and took home the Rookie of the Year award in addition to being named First Runner-Up to advance to nationals. Earning only one spot away from the national competition testifies to a rewarding first year for the Crown SIFE team.

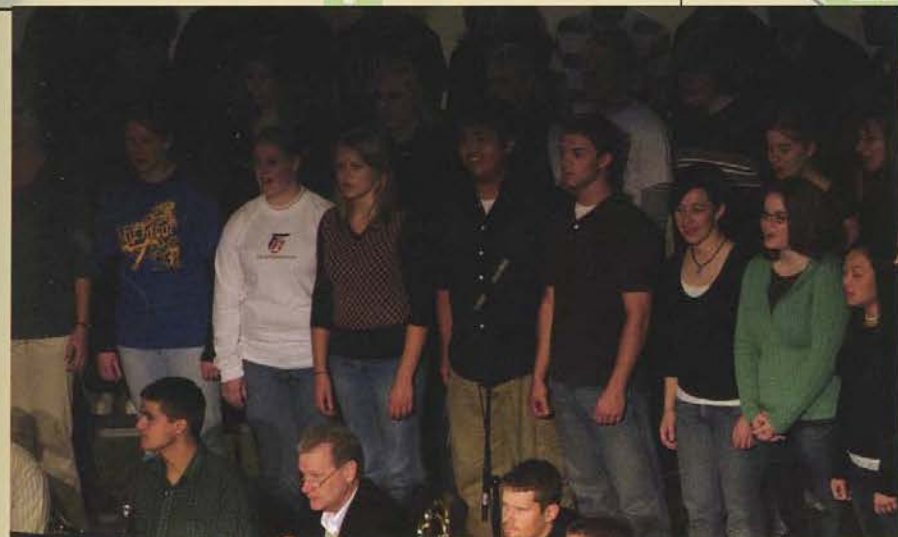
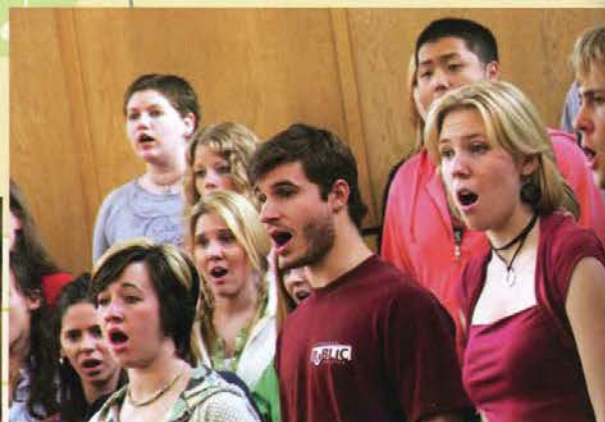
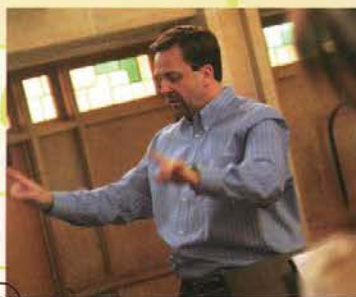


Choir

Encore!

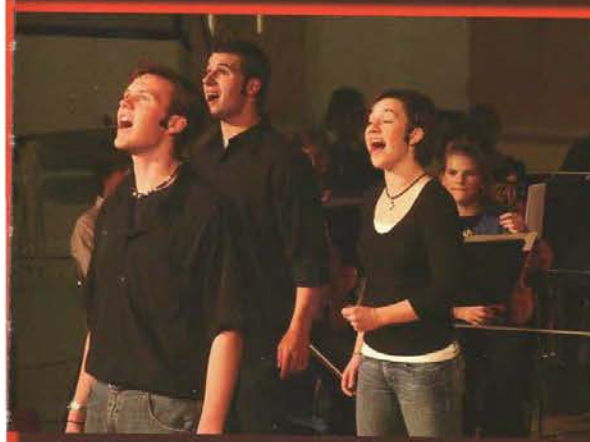

Dance



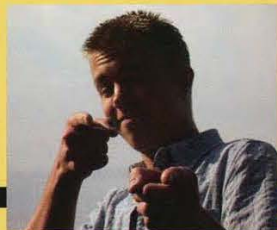

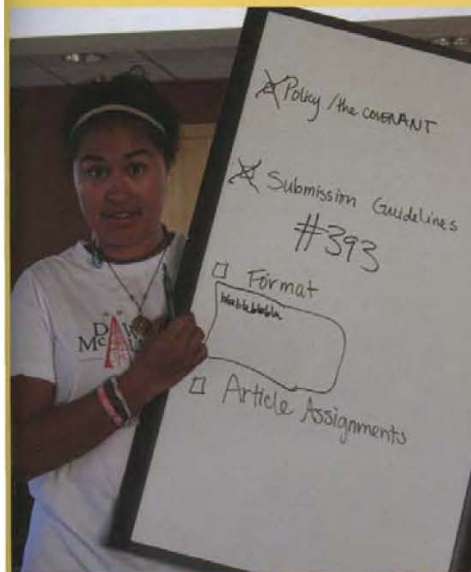

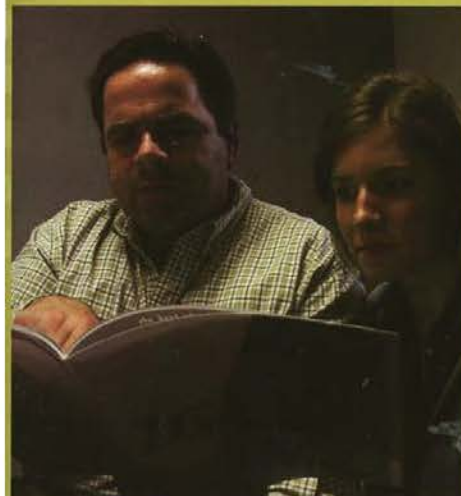

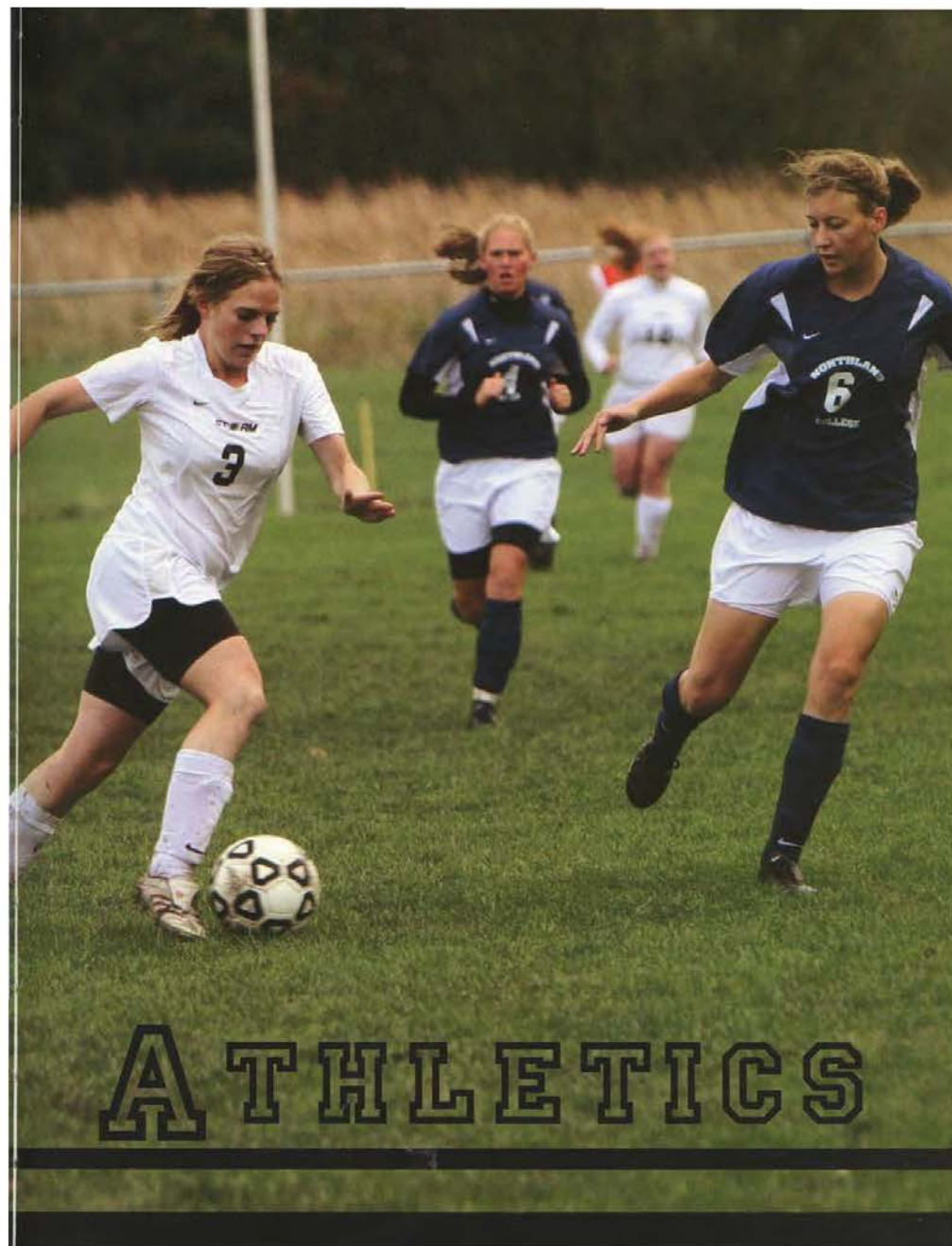

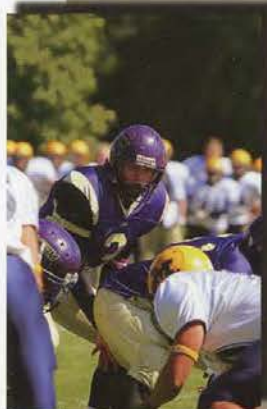

THE WINNING SEASON

The Crown Football team had a record-breaking year. The 2007-2008 season was the first winning season for the team in Crown College history. Their overall record was 5-4, and they were 4-3 in the UMAC. In addition, Crown scored a season total of 315 points, shattering the previous record of 241. Senior quarterback, Matt Bremer, finished his career with the Storm with a great season. He led the team in points, with 74. Lemone Johnson led Crown in rushing yards with 897 yards, nearly 100 yards a game, and Drew Milner broke the Crown record for receiving touchdowns with 10. Senior, Brian Swanson, with 32 solo tackles and 68 assisted tackles, became Crown's all-time leading tackler. The Crown offensive line, which was the largest in the conference, gave up only three sacks during the season. Three of these linemen, Casey Reeves, Josh Prokosh and Clayton Taylor, received First Team All-Conference Honors. Crown is looking to build off of this successful season as they look forward to the future of the program.

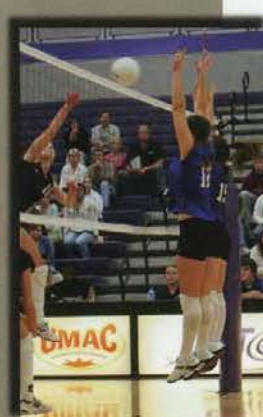

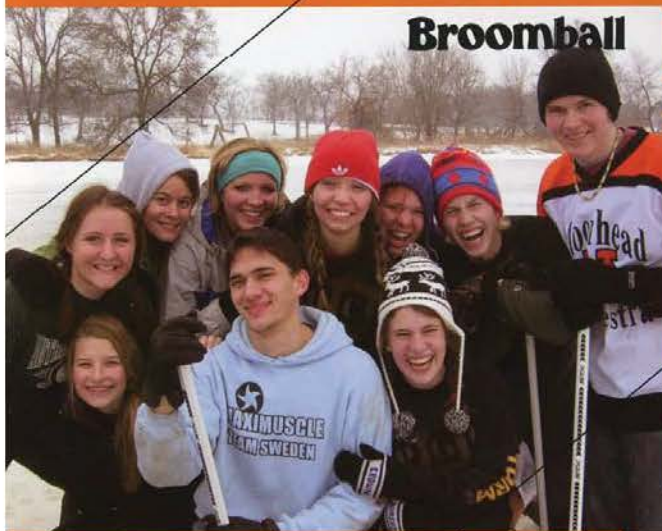
