



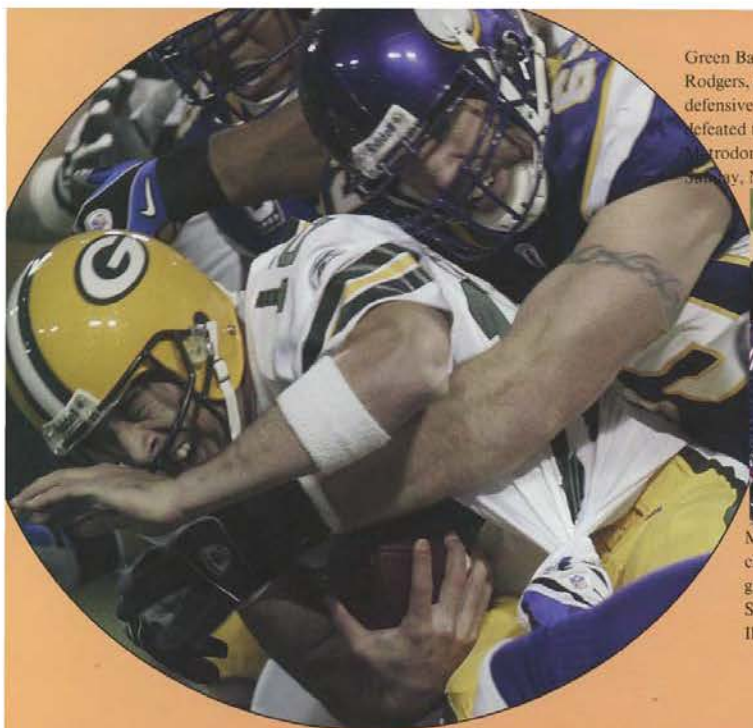

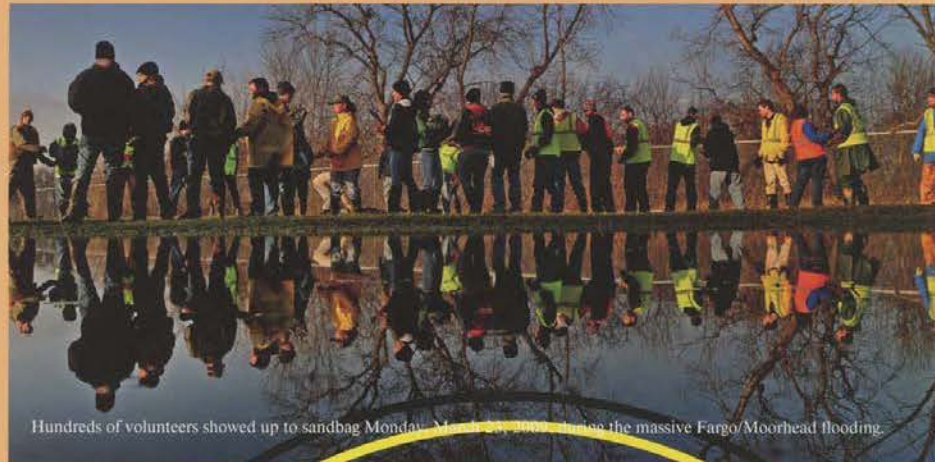

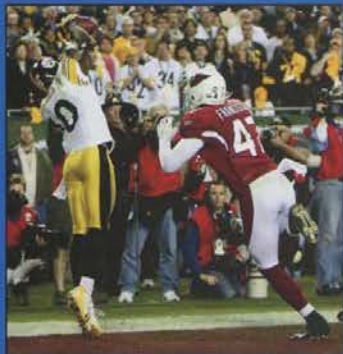

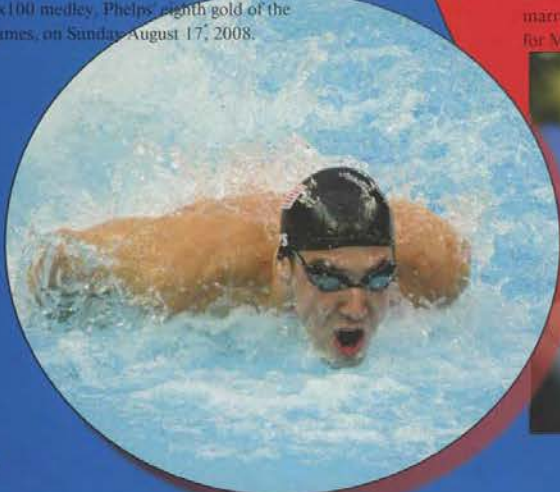

A New Church A New Way



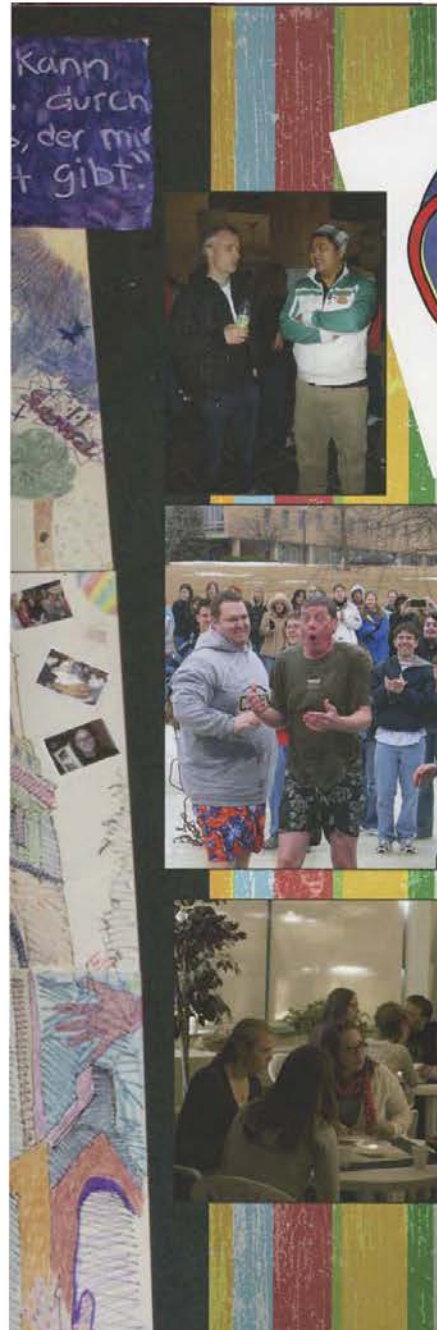

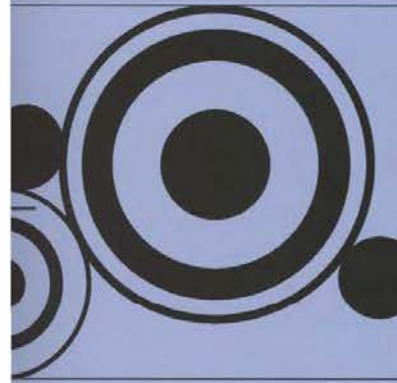

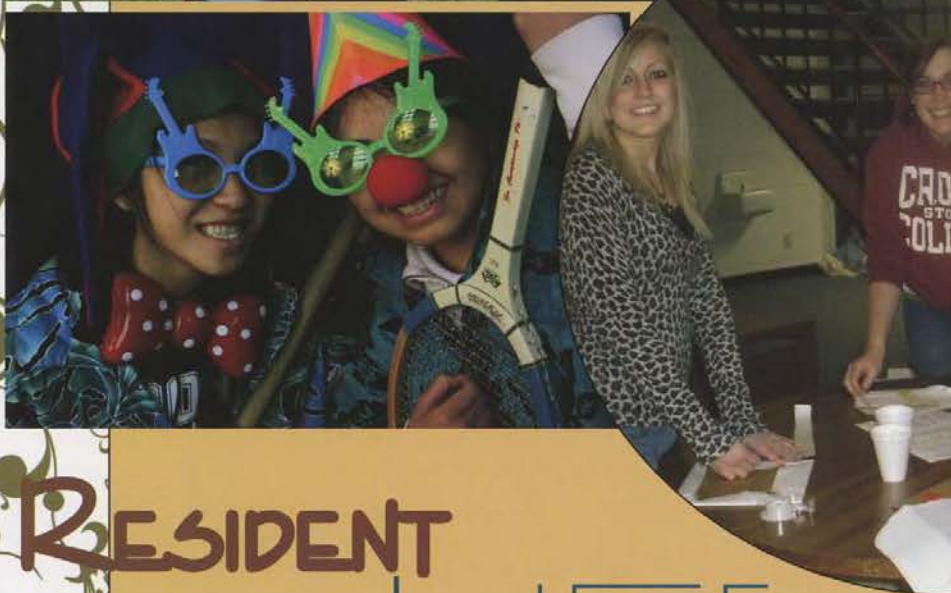
## What "Reely" Happened

## Chapel

Chapel is the only campus-wide gathering of the Crown community on a regular basis. Crown chapels are set aside for corporate worship, Biblical instruction toward Christ-like living, and advancing the global mission of Christ. As a community event, students, faculty, and staff play an integral role in the chapel ministry. Crown's chapel theme for 2008-2009 was "One," which served to focus the campus on the unity that believers share in Christ.

This year, in addition to regular chapel ministries, such as weekly services and Deeper Life, the theme introduced several new elements to chapel. In the fall, Mondays were dedicated to preaching through the "one-another" commandments found in the New Testament. Expository messages were preached by faculty and staff and local pastors. Chapels were also dedicated to practicing the "one anothers" with extended time for prayer, foot washing, confession, healing prayer, and acts of service. At Christmas, the campus rallied in unity to provide Christmas gifts to three local families in need, which provided a wonderful closing to the fall semester. The outpouring of generosity was inspiring.

The spring semester brought an idea to life that had not been done at Crown before...small groups during chapel time. In honor of the Lenten season, the Crown community wrote devotionals for each day leading up to Easter. These devotionals became the focus of the small group discussions each Wednesday.

Another special chapel event was the Relational Summit hosted in April. Offered during chapel times, students attended a variety of workshops on relationships. Sessions were offered on forgiveness, helping friends with depression, how to address issues with parents, issues related to the early years of marriage, communication, and purity. Through all this, chapels this year propelled the campus toward the theme verse, Romans 12:5, which reads, "So in Christ we who are many form one body, and each member belongs to all the others."

Every year the Global Impact Team of Crown puts on a special event called Missions Festival in the fall. The purpose of the festival is to engage Crown students' hearts and minds in the various forms of missions going on around the world and to help students understand what they can do to further God's Kingdom among the nations. The 2008-2009 Missions Festival was one to remember! Special guest Ghassan Thomas from Iraq was the fabulous guest speaker. Crown students gave a standing ovation to this remarkable brother in Christ after hearing numerous stories of what God is doing in Iraq, such as a lost, Muslim country. Churches are being built, men and women are receiving Christ after having dreams and visions, and Ghassan and many others are facing and enduring persecution by the grace of God.

In addition to Thomas' messages, there were many events during Missions Festival including seminars, a missionary clue game, sports, and times of prayer for the nations.

The main highlight of the Festival was Globe Trekking. Students and faculty were given an opportunity to travel through parts of the world without stepping off Crown's campus. Five classrooms were transformed into Africa, two areas of Asia, Germany, and South America. Each room gave students and faculty a way to interact with different cultures and see how ministry is being done around the world. Many students were touched by these rooms, and several students were led to pray for specific areas of the world because of their experience.

In addition to the Missions Festival in the fall, the Global Impact Team of 2008-2009 decided to put on a Mini-Missions Festival during the spring semester. This came about because a special guest was coming to Crown, Pastor Rainer Schacke from Berlin, Germany. Rainer pastors the small, Berlin church-plant, Freischwimmer, Crown's missions project for 2008-2009. Rainer was a guest speaker for several chapels as well as other seminars during the Mini-Missions Festival. During this Mini-Missions Fest, GIT put on an Art Night to help raise more awareness for the GIT project as well as to raise money for Rainer's church in Germany. Numerous students and faculty were involved by performing music and dance routines, creating henna tattoos, and producing many other forms of art. The climax of this Mini-Missions Fest was the Swim Freeze Plunge when Dr. Moats, Dwight Carlblom, Coach Auer, MIR Jerry Kragt, Victoria Crowley, and Koob Vang jumped into the frozen front pond because over \$9,000 was raised by the Crown community for the Freischwimmer church! 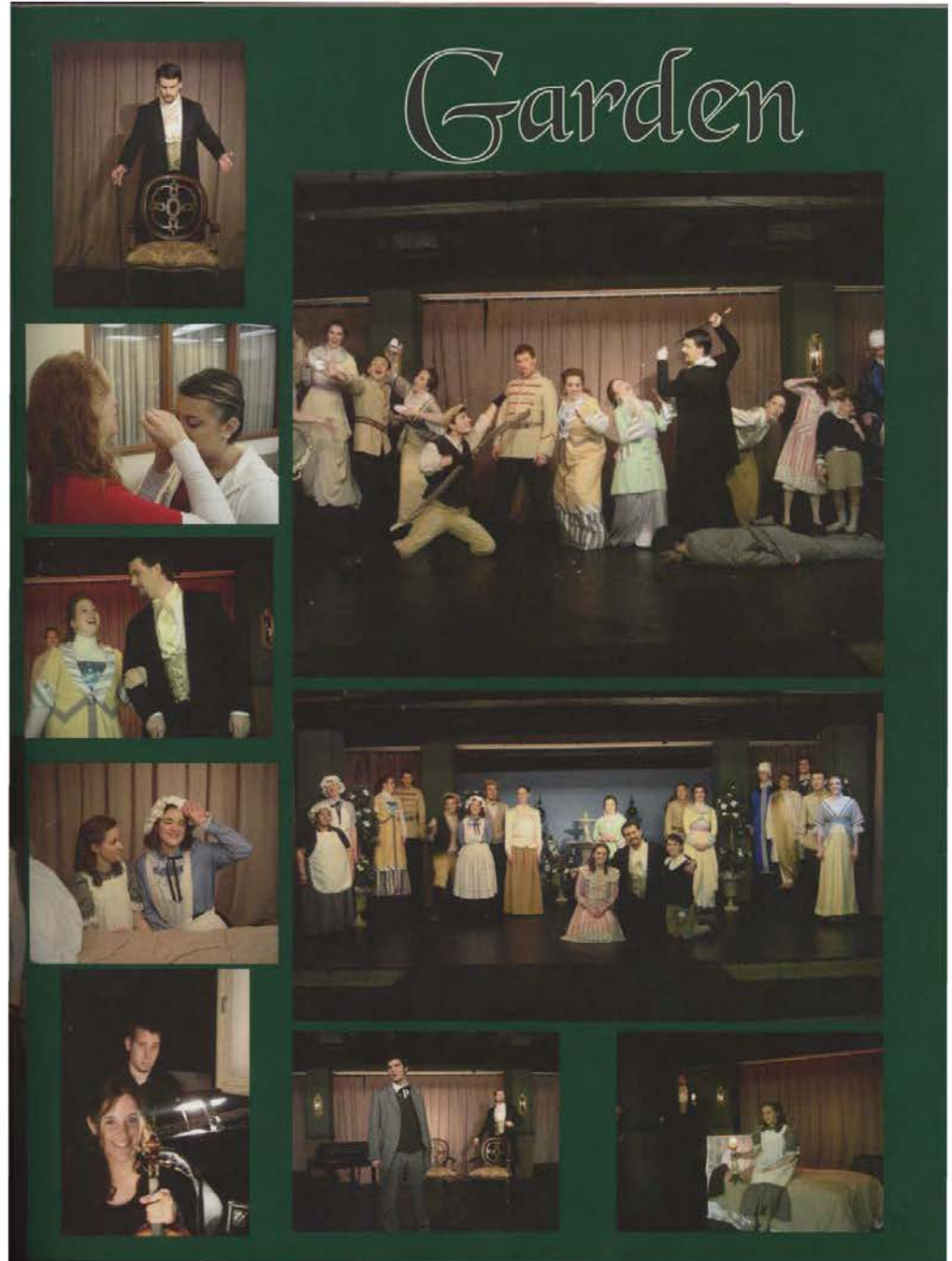

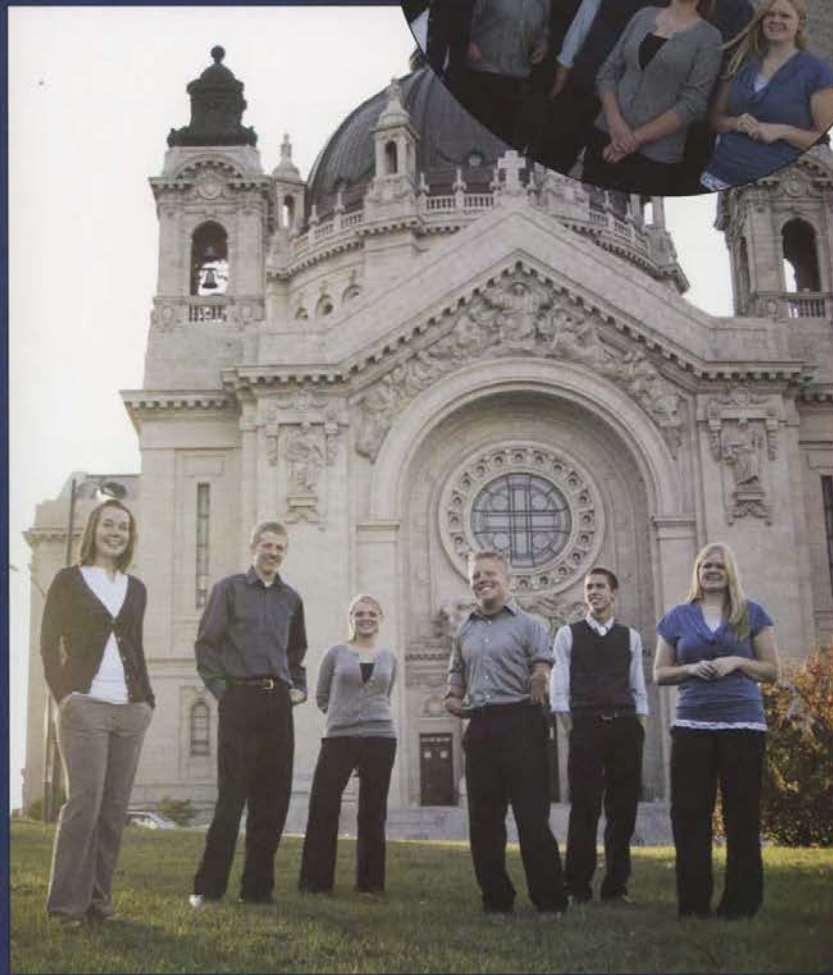


# Life Voice

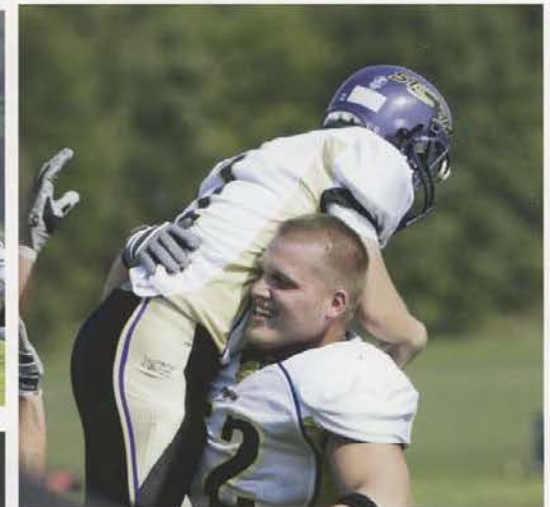
# Storm

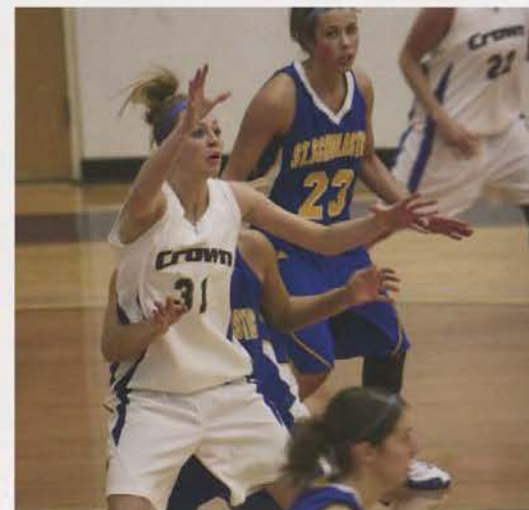

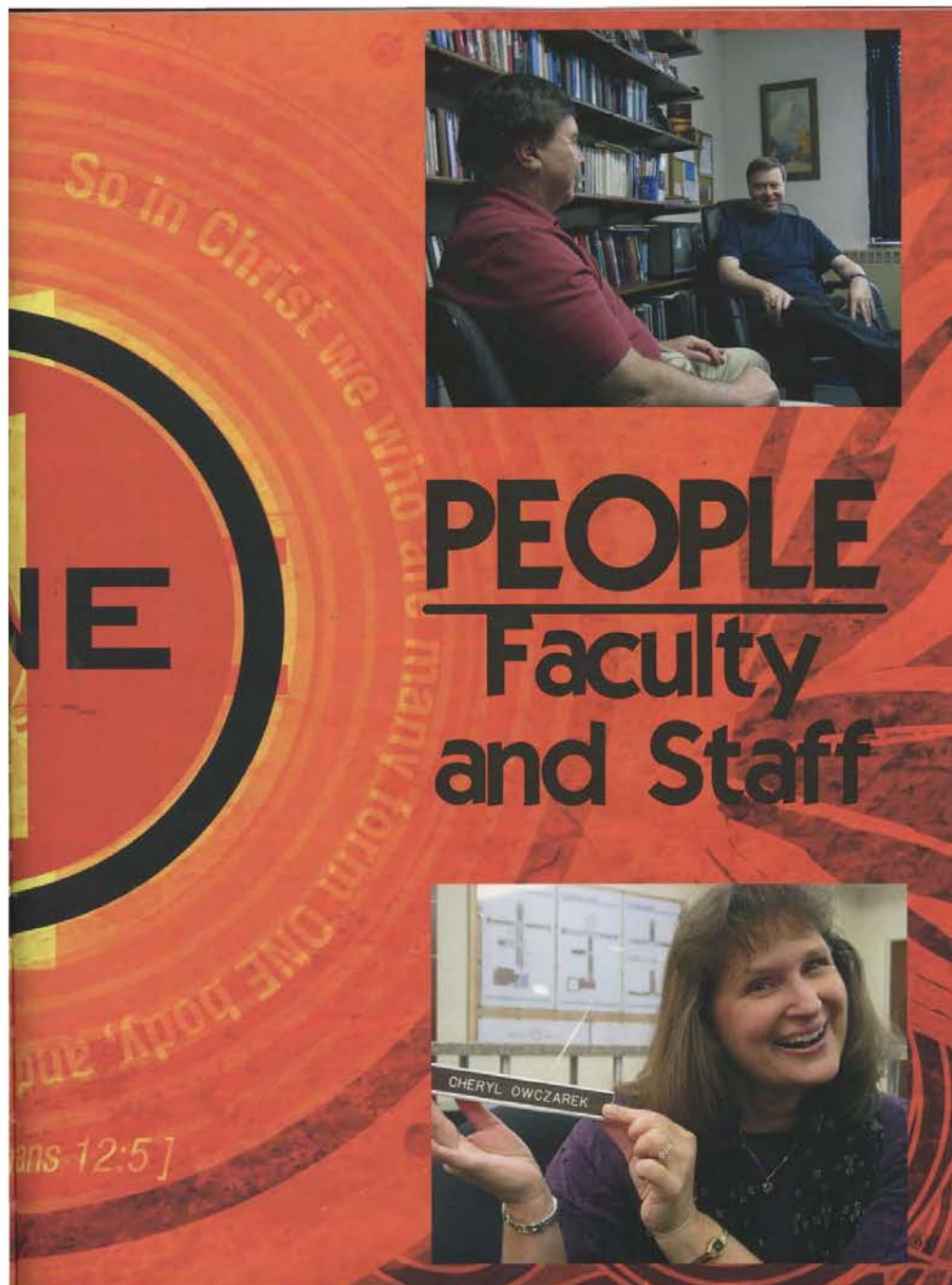
