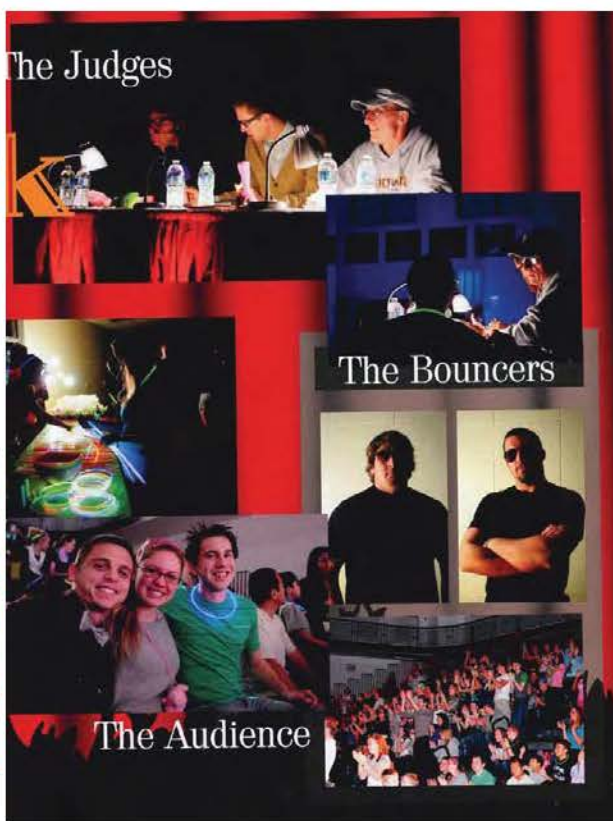
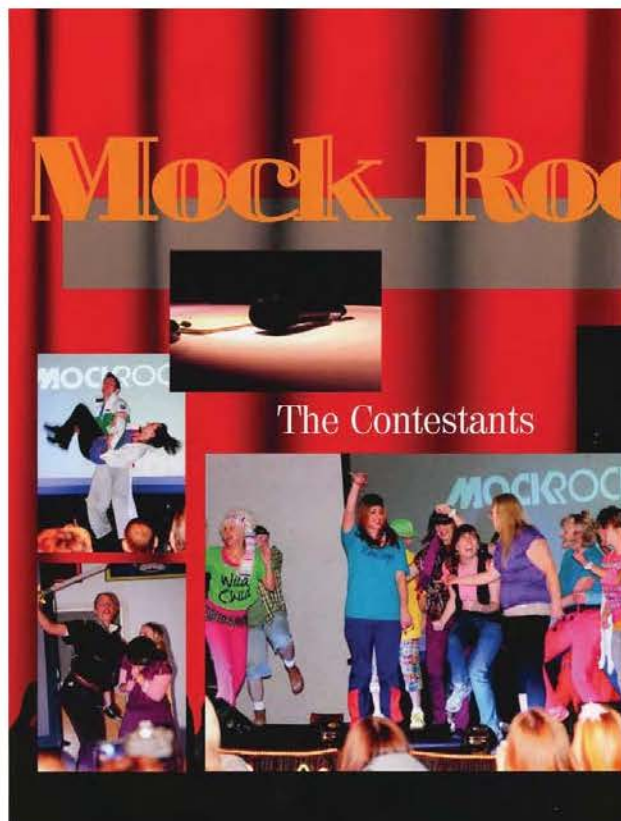



FOOTBALL GAME



Crown College welcomed the Westminster College Blue Jays from Fulton, Missouri to town. The game started out exactly how Crown drew it up as the defense forced a three and out and the Crown offense took over at their own 42 yard line. Although set back by a few penalties, Crown overcame those and drove all the way down to the four yard line before fumbling the ball away. It would be the theme of the game as Crown would end up fumbling four times before the day was through, losing three of them.

Even with their offensive struggles, the game was never out of reach. The Storm took a 6-0 lead with 23 minutes left in the 1st quarter on a Josh Ganados' pass to Terrell Thomas. The ensuing point after would lead to disaster as a poor snap led to a fumble that was returned all the way for a Blue Jay 2-point conversion, making the score 6-2.

The second quarter would see more defensive stands as both teams exchanged punts. At 2:59 left in the half, Crown caught a tough break on a running into the kicker call after what would have been a three and out. Westminster would eventually punch that drive in with :09 seconds left on the clock. The half would end at 10-6 Westminster.

The second half would see more defensive stands as Crown and Westminster matched each other's touchdowns. Westminster getting theirs via a Joel Plassmeyer pass to Scott Rodgers. Crown would respond with another Ganados to Thomas hookup making the score 16-12.

The 4th quarter would start seeing Plassmeyer immediately hit Josh Gladstone for a touchdown to put Westminster on top 24-12. Crown would never really respond after that seeing a couple of drives die out after some good yardage gained. Westminster would tack on another score with 1:13 left to seal the win with another Plassmeyer to Gladstone connection. The final score was 30-12.

Crown was led on offense by sophomore Josh Ganados who had his first collegiate start with 159 yards passing and 42 yards rushing on the day. Junior Amos Schmidt also rushed 13 times for 73 yards. The defense got another big day from UMAC Player of the Week Zach Juszczak with 6.5 tackles including a sack and four tackles for loss.



The day was filled with festivities with the the sound of the pep band, laughter, cheer, carnival food, rock wall, and inflatable games.

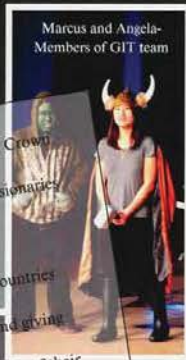
G.I.T

The Global Impact Team play a major part in Crown College's involvement in partnering with missionaries from around the world.

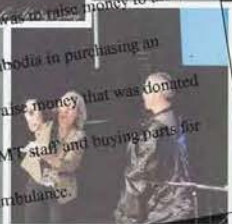
They make the students aware of other countries situations by bringing special speakers and giving international students an opportunity to talk of their country.

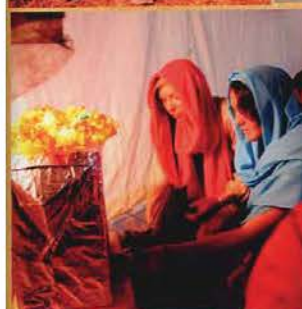
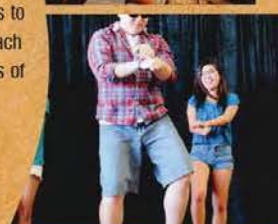

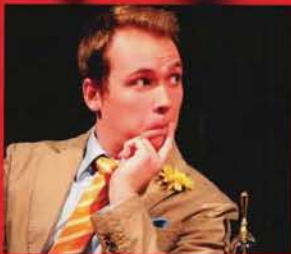
Concert

"Our MVP for men's golf is Reed Sorensen. He had a tremendous freshman season. His performance was one of the most decorated freshman seasons in the history of the Crown College Golf Program. He was named UMAC player of the week just a few weeks into his college career. He tied for 4th place at the UMAC Conference Tournament fighting through 40 mph winds and sub 40 degree weather. Reed shot the lowest round of the three round tournament, 75 (3 over par). This earned him All Conference Honors, which is one of the highest recognitions only a handful of golfers have earned in Crown College Golf history. Overall, the team competed at a high level considering the youth on the team. The team received a huge contribution from Jose Cueva during the Viking Invitational; when he placed 2nd with a 76, four over par. Also, freshman Austin Galligan produced some fine rounds from the number three position in the golf lineup. Moving forward, Crown Golf has some very strong recruits coming in for next year. The program is definitely on the rise, and the future is extremely bright."
