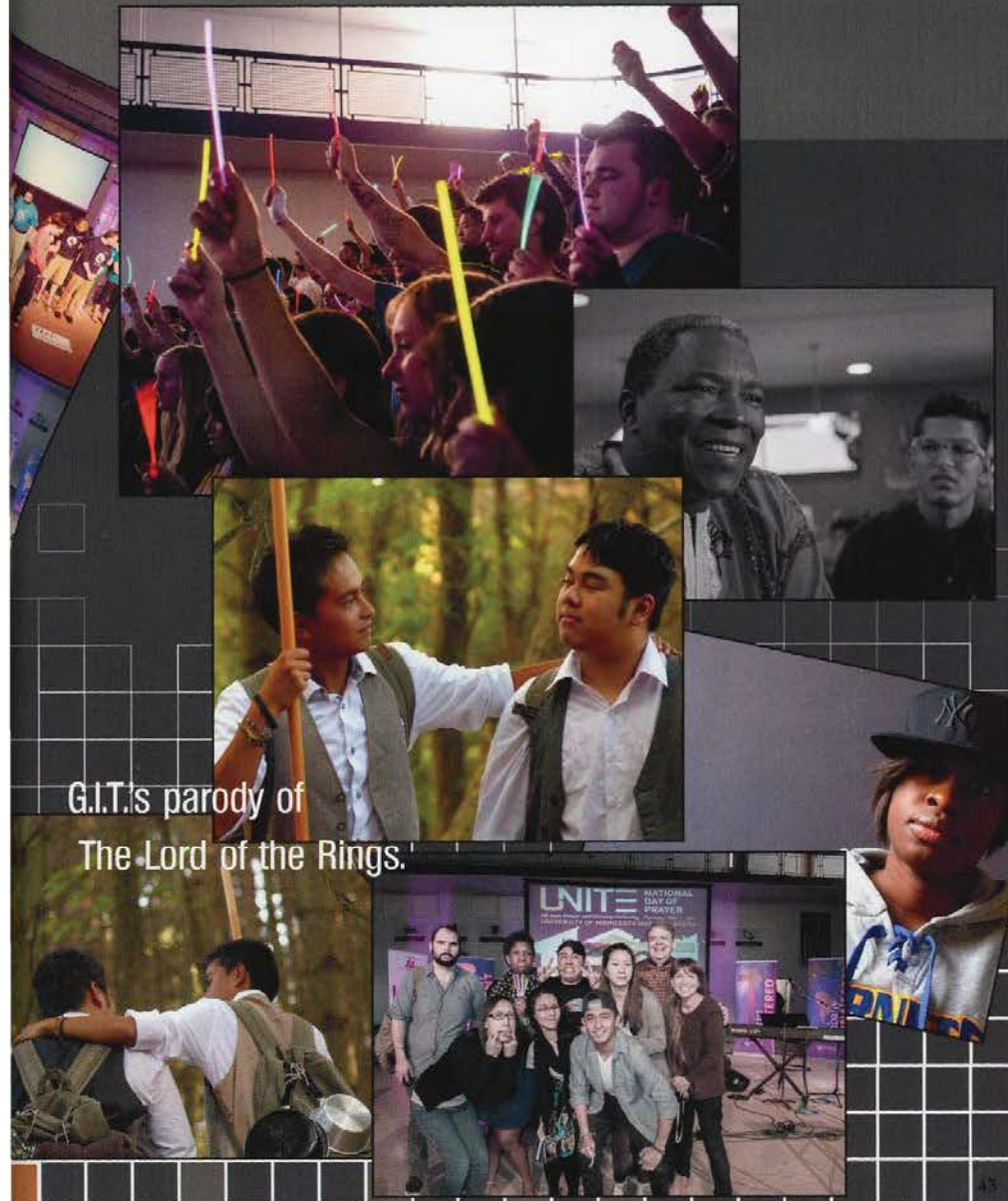


Student Athletic Advisory Committee SAAC

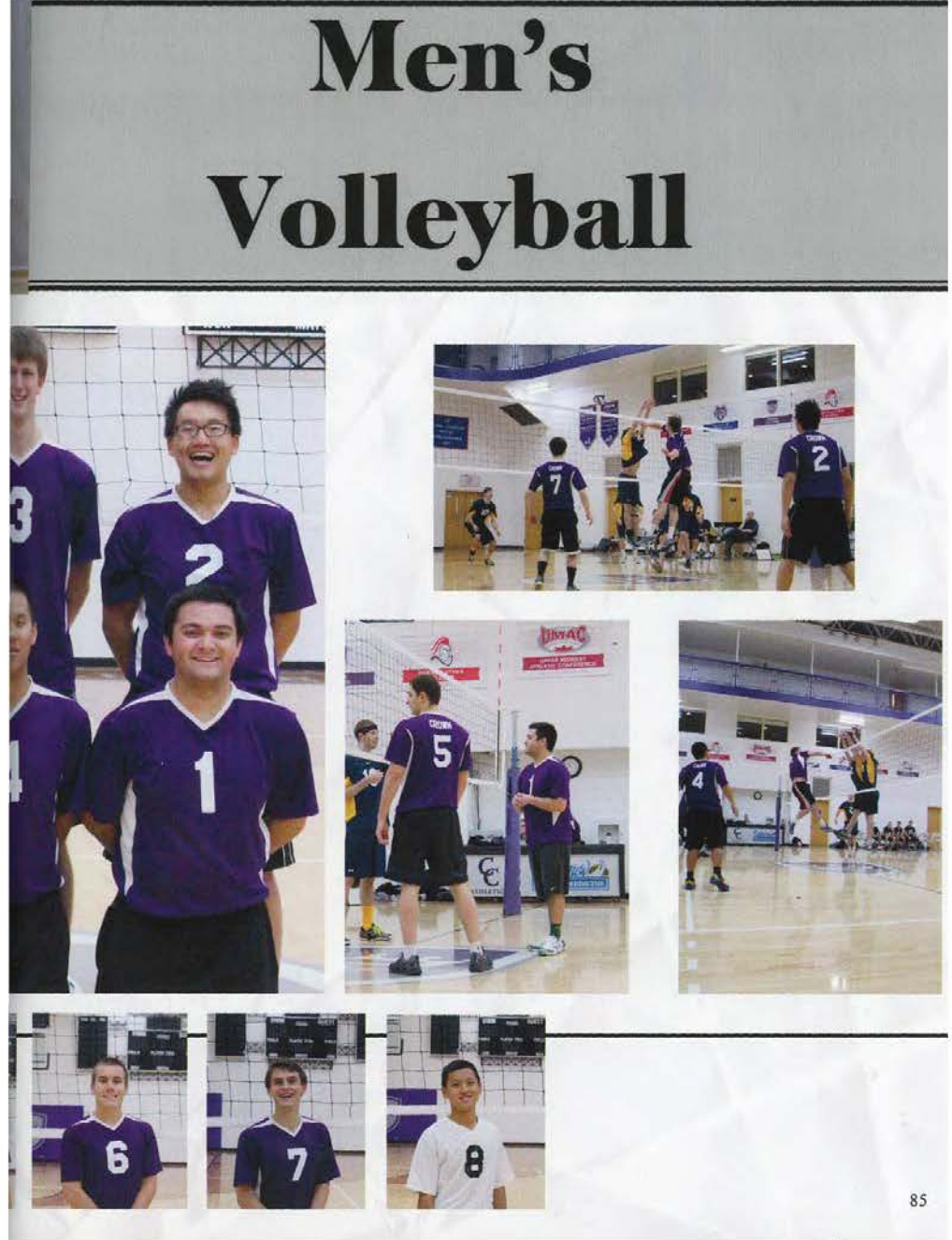
Baseball
