GOOGLE SEARCHING

To increase your chances of finding primary resources look for digital archives and not blog or personal opinion websites.

Limit by site type

Look for .edu
.gov
.org

HOW?

GOOGLE LIMITING BY SITE TYPE

In search box put...

site:.edu constitution

Purple=limiter

Black= term(s)

Now only .edu and more academic sites will appear in search, no .coms

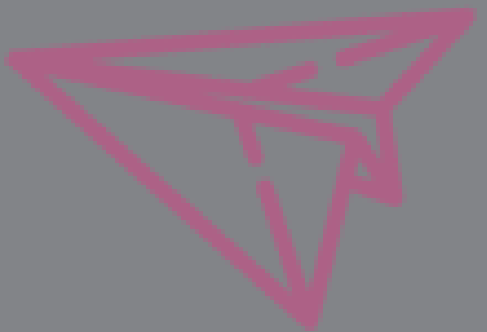
